25	1. Christine J. Lally (Complainant) is the	e Interim Executive Director of the Medical
26	Board of California (Board). She brought this action solely in her official capacity and is	
27	represented in this matter by Xavier Becerra, Attorney General of the State of California, by Greg	
28	W. Chambers, Deputy Attorney General.	
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- 2. Joshua Todd Schechtel, M.D. (Respondent) is represented in this proceeding by attorney Robert F. Hahn, whose address is: 2550 Ninth Street, Suite 101, Berkeley, California 94710.
- 3. On or about September 5, 1989, the Board issued Physician's and Surgeon's Certificate No. G 66905 to Respondent. The Physician's and Surgeon's Certificate was in full force and effect at all times relevant to the charges brought in First Amended Accusation No. 800-2017-029555 and will expire on November 30, 2020, unless renewed.

#### **JURISDICTION**

4. Accusation No. 800-2017-029555 was filed before the Board. The Accusation and all other statutorily required documents were properly served on Respondent on November 26, 2019. Respondent timely filed his Notice of Defense contesting the Accusation. On May 1, 2020, First Amended Accusation No. 800-2017-029555 was filed before the Board and properly serviced with other statutorily required documents. A copy of First Amended Accusation No. 800-2017-029555 is attached as Exhibit A and incorporated by reference.

#### ADVISEMENT AND WAIVERS

- 5. Respondent has carefully read, fully discussed with counsel, and understands the charges and allegations in First Amended Accusation No. 800-2017-029555. Respondent also has carefully read, fully discussed with counsel, and understands the effects of this Stipulated Surrender of License and Order.
- 6. Respondent is fully aware of his legal rights in this matter, including the right to a hearing on the charges and allegations in the First Amended Accusation; the right to confront and cross-examine the witnesses against him; the right to present evidence and to testify on his own behalf; the right to the issuance of subpoenas to compel the attendance of witnesses and the production of documents; the right to reconsideration and court review of an adverse decision; and all other rights accorded by the California Administrative Procedure Act and other applicable laws.
- 7. Respondent voluntarily, knowingly, and intelligently waives and gives up each and every right set forth above.

#### **CULPABILITY**

- 8. Respondent understands that the charges and allegations in First Amended Accusation No. 800-2017-029555, if proven at a hearing, constitute cause for imposing discipline upon his Physician's and Surgeon's Certificate.
- 9. For the purpose of resolving the First Amended Accusation without the expense and uncertainty of further proceedings, Respondent agrees that, at a hearing, Complainant could establish a factual basis for the charges in the First Amended Accusation and that those charges constitute cause for discipline. Respondent hereby gives up his right to contest that cause for discipline exists based on those charges.
- 10. Respondent understands that by signing this stipulation he enables the Board to issue an order accepting the surrender of his Physician's and Surgeon's Certificate without further process.

#### **CONTINGENCY**

- 11. This stipulation shall be subject to approval by the Board. Respondent understands and agrees that counsel for Complainant and the staff of the Board may communicate directly with the Board regarding this stipulation and surrender, without notice to or participation by Respondent or his counsel. By signing the stipulation, Respondent understands and agrees that he may not withdraw his agreement or seek to rescind the stipulation prior to the time the Board considers and acts upon it. If the Board fails to adopt this stipulation as its Decision and Order, the Stipulated Surrender and Disciplinary Order shall be of no force or effect, except for this paragraph, it shall be inadmissible in any legal action between the parties, and the Board shall not be disqualified from further action by having considered this matter.
- 12. The parties understand and agree that Portable Document Format (PDF) and facsimile copies of this Stipulated Surrender of License and Order, including PDF and facsimile signatures thereto, shall have the same force and effect as the originals.
- 13. In consideration of the foregoing admissions and stipulations, the parties agree that the Board may, without further notice or formal proceeding, issue and enter the following Order:

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#### **ORDER**

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that Physician's and Surgeon's Certificate No. G 66905, issued to Respondent Joshua Todd Schechtel, M.D., is surrendered and accepted by the Board.

- 1. The surrender of Respondent's Physician's and Surgeon's Certificate and the acceptance of the surrendered license by the Board shall constitute the imposition of discipline against Respondent. This stipulation constitutes a record of the discipline and shall become a part of Respondent's license history with the Board.
- Respondent shall lose all rights and privileges as a physician and surgeon in California as of the effective date of the Board's Decision and Order.
- 3. Respondent shall cause to be delivered to the Board his pocket license and, if one was issued, his wall certificate on or before the effective date of the Decision and Order.
- 4. If Respondent ever files an application for licensure or a petition for reinstatement in the State of California, the Board shall treat it as a petition for reinstatement. Respondent must comply with all the laws, regulations and procedures for reinstatement of a revoked or surrendered license in effect at the time the petition is filed, and all of the charges and allegations contained in First Amended Accusation No. 800-2017-029555 shall be deemed to be true, correct and admitted by Respondent when the Board determines whether to grant or deny the petition.
- 5. If Respondent should ever apply or reapply for a new license or certification, or petition for reinstatement of a license, by any other health care licensing agency in the State of California, all of the charges and allegations contained in First Amended Accusation, No. 800-2017-029555 shall be deemed to be true, correct, and admitted by Respondent for the purpose of any Statement of Issues or any other proceeding seeking to deny or restrict licensure.

25	Surgeon's Certificate was in full force and effect at all times relevant to the charges brought

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(JOSHUA TODD SCHECHTEL, M.D.) FIRST AMENDED ACCUSATION NO. 800-2017-029555

#### **JURISDICTION**

- 3. This First Amended Accusation is brought before the Board, under the authority of the following laws. All section references are to the Business and Professions Code (Code) unless otherwise indicated.
- 4. Section 2227 of the Code provides that a licensee who is found guilty under the Medical Practice Act may have his or her license revoked, suspended for a period not to exceed one year, placed on probation and required to pay the costs of probation monitoring, or such other action taken in relation to discipline as the Board deems proper.
  - 5. Section 2234 of the Code, states:

The board shall take action against any licensee who is charged with unprofessional conduct. In addition to other provisions of this article, unprofessional conduct includes, but is not limited to, the following:

- (a) Violating or attempting to violate, directly or indirectly, assisting in or abetting the violation of, or conspiring to violate any provision of this chapter.
  - (b) Gross negligence.
- (c) Repeated negligent acts. To be repeated, there must be two or more negligent acts or omissions. An initial negligent act or omission followed by a separate and distinct departure from the applicable standard of care shall constitute repeated negligent acts.
- (1) An initial negligent diagnosis followed by an act or omission medically appropriate for that negligent diagnosis of the patient shall constitute a single negligent act.
- (2) When the standard of care requires a change in the diagnosis, act, or omission that constitutes the negligent act described in paragraph (1), including, but not limited to, a reevaluation of the diagnosis or a change in treatment, and the licensee's conduct departs from the applicable standard of care, each departure constitutes a separate and distinct breach of the standard of care.
  - (d) Incompetence.
- (e) The commission of any act involving dishonesty or corruption which is substantially related to the qualifications, functions, or duties of a physician and surgeon.

- (f) Any action or conduct which would have warranted the denial of a certificate.
- (g) The failure by a certificate holder, in the absence of good cause, to attend and participate in an interview by the board. This subdivision shall only apply to a certificate holder who is the subject of an investigation by the board.
- 6. Section 2266 of the Code states: The failure of a physician and surgeon to maintain adequate and accurate records relating to the provision of services to their patients constitutes unprofessional conduct.

#### FIRST CAUSE FOR DISCIPLINE

(Unprofessional Conduct: Gross Negligence, and/or Repeated Negligent Acts; and/or Failure to Maintain Accurate and Adequate Medical Records for Pt. 1)<sup>1</sup>

- 7. Respondent is subject to disciplinary action under sections 2234 [unprofessional conduct]; and/or 2234(b) [gross negligence]; and/or 2234(c) [repeated negligent acts]; and/or 2266 [failure to keep accurate and adequate medical records] based on his care and treatment of Pt. 1. The circumstances are as follows:
- 8. On or about September 16, 2016, a male infant, Pt. 1, was born following induction due to maternal preeclampsia. His mother's status for Group B Streptococcus ("GBS") was unknown. On September 17, 2016, Pt. 1 was admitted to the Newborn Intensive Care Unit ("NICU") for hypoglycemia. On September 18, 2016, Pt. 1 was discharged from the hospital.
- 9. On September 19, 2016, Pt. 1 was brought to the emergency room, then readmitted to the NICU with low body weight, low body temperature, jaundice, and a blood sugar level of 22 mg/dL. Prior to the NICU admission, Pt. 1 was observed to be "jittery" and "cool to touch/acrocyanosis." Additionally, Pt. 1 had a history of inconsistent nursing and low maternal milk supply, and the medical records noted that Pt. 1 was not interested in nursing.
- 10. Respondent allowed Pt. I to nurse for ten minutes before treating hypoglycemia and jitteriness with a formula feeding, even though hypoglycemia is a medical problem that requires immediate attention.

<sup>&</sup>lt;sup>1</sup> In order to protect the patients' privacy, the patients are hereto identified in the Accusation as follows: "Pt.1"; "Pt. 2"; and "Pt.3." Respondent may learn the identity of the patients during discovery.

- 11. Respondent failed to investigate whether Pt. 1 had sepsis, even though (1) the hospital normally routinely conducts sepsis workups on babies admitted for jaundice, and (2) poor feeding and temperature instability are red flags that normally direct a physician to perform a review for early-onset neonatal sepsis.
- 12. After examining Pt. 1, Respondent documented that Pt. 1 appeared to have jaundice, but Respondent failed to note in the medical records whether he observed symptoms of hypoglycemia and/or sepsis, as others had noted after their previous examinations of Pt. 1.

#### SECOND CAUSE FOR DISCIPLINE

(Unprofessional Conduct: Gross Negligence; and/or Failure to Maintain Accurate and Adequate Medical Records for Pt. 2 and Pt. 3)

- 13. Respondent is subject to disciplinary action under sections 2234 [unprofessional conduct]; and/or 2234(b) [gross negligence]; and/or 2266 [failure to keep accurate and adequate medical records] based on his care and treatment of Pt. 2 and Pt. 3. The circumstances are as follows:
- 14. On or about August 26, 2016, Pt. 2 and Pt. 3, twins, were born and then admitted to the NICU for management of prematurity.
- 15. On August 26, 2016, Respondent ordered a complete blood count ("CBC") for Pt. 2 and Pt. 3, then never followed up or acted on the results. No sepsis work-up was ordered, no antibiotics were requested, and there was no documentation that antibiotic stewardship was ever considered.
- 16. The platelet count, included in the CBC, is important in premature infants who are at risk for intracranial hemorrhage. Pt. 2 and Pt. 3 each had a Grade 1 hemorrhage. Additionally, the hemoglobin and hematocrit ("Hgb/Hct") counts for Pt. 2, included in the CBC, were elevated and should have been followed by Respondent.
- 17. Respondent failed to provide sufficient detail in the history and physical section of the medical records to provide adequate continuity of care, as identified as follows:
- A. Respondent incorrectly documented the time of the rupture of membrane ("ROM") for Pt. 2. This information is important when evaluating a preterm infant for sepsis.
