of the service Accusation, and provided him with an opportunity to file a Notice of Defense and request relief from default. The United States Post Office tracking system shows that the package was delivered to the address on November 7, 2020. (Exhibit Package, Exhibit 2, Courtesy Notice of Default, proof of service, USPS tracking.)

3. Respondent has not responded to service of the Accusation or the Notice of Default. He has not filed a Notice of Defense. As a result, Respondent has waived his right to a hearing on the merits to contest the allegations contained in the Accusation.

#### FINDINGS OF FACT

- 4. William Prasifka is the Board's Executive Director. The charges and allegations in the Accusation were at all times brought and maintained solely in the official capacity of the Board's Executive Director.
- 5. On August 26, 1975, Physician's and Surgeon's Certificate No. C36737 was issued by the Board to Larry Homer Smith, M.D. The certificate is delinquent, having expired on July 31, 2020, and is suspended by virtue of an Order issued on August 12, 2020, pursuant to Business and Professions Code section 2310(a). (Exhibit Package, Exhibit 3, license certification.)
- 6. On September 28, 2020, Respondent was duly served with an Accusation, alleging causes for discipline against Respondent. A Courtesy Notice of Default was thereafter served on Respondent. Respondent failed to file a Notice of Defense.
  - 7. The allegations of the Accusation are true as follows:

On February 17, 2020, the Louisiana State Board of Medical Examiners issued an Interim Consent Order regarding Respondent's license to practice medicine in the State of Louisiana. Under the terms of the Interim Consent Order, Respondent's Louisiana license is indefinitely suspended.<sup>2</sup> The Interim Consent Order was issued based on information that Respondent suffers from a medical condition that affects his ability to safely practice medicine. Respondent's Louisiana license will only be reinstated following a re-evaluation and a satisfactory report concerning Respondent's medical condition, a meeting with Louisiana board personnel and the

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#### **JURISDICTION**

- 3. This Accusation is brought before the Medical Board of California under the authority of the following sections of the California Business and Professions Code (Code) and/or other relevant statutory enactment:
  - A. Section 2227 of the Code provides in part that the Board may revoke, suspend for a period not to exceed one year, or place on probation, the license of any licensee who has been found guilty under the Medical Practice Act, and may recover the costs of probation monitoring.
  - B. Section 2305 of the Code provides, in part, that the revocation, suspension, or other discipline, restriction or limitation imposed by another state upon a license to practice medicine issued by that state, or the revocation, suspension, or restriction of the authority to practice medicine by any agency of the federal government, that would have been grounds for discipline in California under the Medical Practice Act, constitutes grounds for discipline for unprofessional conduct.
  - C. Section 141 of the Code provides:
    - "(a) For any licensee holding a license issued by a board under the jurisdiction of a department, a disciplinary action taken by another state, by any agency of the federal government, or by another country for any act substantially related to the practice regulated by the California license, may be a ground for disciplinary action by the respective state licensing board. A certified copy of the record of the disciplinary action taken against the licensee by another state, an agency of the federal government, or by another country shall be conclusive evidence of the events related therein."
    - "(b) Nothing in this section shall preclude a board from applying a specific statutory provision in the licensing act administered by the board that provides for discipline based upon a disciplinary action taken against the licensee by another state, an agency of the federal government, or another country."

#### FIRST CAUSE FOR DISCIPLINE

## (Discipline, Restriction, or Limitation Imposed by Another State)

4. On February 17, 2020, the Louisiana State Board of Medical Examiners issued an Interim Consent Order regarding Respondent's license to practice medicine in the State of Louisiana. The Interim Consent Order was issued based on information that Respondent suffers

INTERIM CONSENT ORDER

This matter is before the Louisiana State Board of Medical Examiners (the "Board") in connection with an ongoing and pending investigation conducted by the Investigating Officer of the Board regarding Laurence H. Smith, M.D. ("Dr. Smith"), a physician who at all pertinent times has been licensed and engaged in the practice of cardiothoracic surgery in and around New Orleans, Louisiana.

The Board received apparently reliable information that indicates that Dr. Smith suffers from a medical condition, which affects his ability to practice with skill and safety.

Predicated upon the information outlined above, the Investigating Officer assigned by the Board with respect to this matter has determined that reasonable cause exists for recommending that a formal Administrative Complaint be filed against Dr. Smith, charging him with violation of the Louisiana Medical Practice Act (the "Act"), pursuant to La. Rev. Stat. §§ 37:1285(A) (25).

As evidenced by his subscription hereto, Dr. Smith acknowledges the right to have written notification of any charges that may be asserted, as well as the right to have evidence of such charges asserted during an administrative hearing at which time he will be entitled to be represented by legal counsel, to call witnesses and to present evidence in defense or in mitigation of the charges made, and to a decision thereon by the Board based upon written findings of fact and conclusions of law, pursuant to La. Rev. Stat. §§49:951, et seq. Irrespective of such rights, Dr. Smith, nonetheless, hereby consents to the indefinite suspension of his license to practice medicine in this state, with reinstatement thereof subject to the terms and conditions of this Order. By his subscription hereto, Dr. Smith authorizes the Investigating Officer designated by

the Board with respect hereto to present this Interim Consent Order to the Board for its consideration and to fully discuss with and disclose to the Board the nature and extent of such charges and he waives any objection to such disclosures under La. Rev. Stat. §49:960. Dr. Smith expressly acknowledges that disclosure of such information to the Board by the Investigating Officer shall be without prejudice to the Investigating Officer's authority to prosecute administrative charges which may be filed in this matter following completion of the current investigation or to the Board's capacity to adjudicate such charges.

Accordingly, in consideration of the foregoing and pursuant to the authority vested in the Board by La. Rev. Stat. §37:1285 and La. Rev. Stat. §49:955(D);

IT IS ORDERED that the license of Laurence H. Smith, M.D. to engage in the practice of medicine in the State of Louisiana, as evidenced by Certificate No.09567, be and the same is hereby, effective as of the date hereof, INDEFINITELY SUSPENDED.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that Laurence H. Smith, M.D. shall not practice medicine in any form in the State of Louisiana until and unless the Board issues and serves a written decision reinstating his license to practice following: (1) a re-evaluation and a satisfactory report concerning his medical condition; (2) a meeting at the Board office with the Director of Investigations or designee; and (3) the conclusion of the pending investigation by administrative hearing and final decision of the Board on any charges that may be filed in these proceedings including, but not limited to, those identified in this Order; or alternatively, by the Board's acceptance of a Consent Order or other disposition of the pending investigation.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that any violation or failure of strict compliance with any of the terms, conditions or restrictions set forth by this Order by Dr. Smith shall be deemed adequate and sufficient cause, upon proof of such violation or failure, for the revocation and cancellation of Dr. Smith's license to practice medicine in the State of Louisiana or for such other action as the Board may deem appropriate, as if such violations were enumerated among the causes provided in La. Rev. Stat. § 37:1285.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that this Interim Consent Order shall be, and shall be deemed to be, a public record.
