18	IT IS HEREBY STIPULATED AND AGREED by and between the parties to the above-	
19	entitled proceedings that the following matters are true:	
20	PARTIES	
21	1. William Prasifka (Complainant) is the Executive Director of the Medical Board of	
22	California (Board). He brought this action solely in his official capacity and is represented in this	
23	matter by Xavier Becerra, Attorney General of the State of California, by Lynne K. Dombrowski,	
24	Deputy Attorney General.	
25	2. MARC FRANK LIEBERMAN, M.D. (Respondent) is represented in this proceeding	
26	by attorney Brock D. Phillips, Esq., whose address is: Pacific West Law Group, LLP, 503 San	
27	Pedro Cove Rd, San Rafael, CA 94901, email: phillips@pacificwestlaw.com.	
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3. On or about July 14, 1980, the Board issued Physician's and Surgeon's Certificate No. G 42547 to MARC FRANK LIEBERMAN, M.D. (Respondent). The Physician's and Surgeon's Certificate was in full force and effect at all times relevant to the charges brought in Accusation No. 800-2017-032796 and it will expire on July 31, 2022, unless renewed.

JURISDICTION

4. Accusation No. 800-2017-032796 was filed before the Board, and is currently pending against Respondent. The Accusation and all other statutorily required documents were properly served on Respondent on May 15, 2020. Respondent timely filed his Notice of Defense contesting the Accusation. A copy of Accusation No. 800-2017-032796 is attached as Exhibit A and incorporated by reference.

ADVISEMENT AND WAIVERS

- 5. Respondent has carefully read, fully discussed with counsel, and understands the charges and allegations in Accusation No. 800-2017-032796. Respondent also has carefully read, fully discussed with counsel, and understands the effects of this Stipulated Surrender of License and Order.
- 6. Respondent is fully aware of his legal rights in this matter, including the right to a hearing on the charges and allegations in the Accusation; the right to confront and cross-examine the witnesses against him; the right to present evidence and to testify on his own behalf; the right to the issuance of subpoenas to compel the attendance of witnesses and the production of documents; the right to reconsideration and court review of an adverse decision; and all other rights accorded by the California Administrative Procedure Act and other applicable laws.
- 7. Respondent voluntarily, knowingly, and intelligently waives and gives up each and every right set forth above.

CULPABILITY

8. Respondent admits the truth of each and every charge and allegation in Accusation No. 800-2017-032796, agrees that cause exists for discipline, and hereby surrenders his Physician's and Surgeon's Certificate No. G 42547 for the Board's formal acceptance.

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9. Respondent understands that, by signing this stipulation, he enables the Board to issue an order accepting the surrender of his Physician's and Surgeon's Certificate without further process.

CONTINGENCY

- 10. This stipulation shall be subject to approval by the Board. Respondent understands and agrees that counsel for Complainant and the staff of the Board may communicate directly with the Board regarding this stipulation and surrender, without notice to or participation by Respondent or his counsel. By signing the stipulation, Respondent understands and agrees that he may not withdraw his agreement or seek to rescind the stipulation prior to the time the Board considers and acts upon it. If the Board fails to adopt this stipulation as its Decision and Order, the Stipulated Surrender and Disciplinary Order shall be of no force or effect, except for this paragraph, it shall be inadmissible in any legal action between the parties, and the Board shall not be disqualified from further action by having considered this matter.
- 11. The parties understand and agree that Portable Document Format (PDF) and facsimile copies of this Stipulated Surrender of License and Order, including PDF and facsimile signatures thereto, shall have the same force and effect as the originals.
- 12. In consideration of the foregoing admissions and stipulations, the parties agree that the Board may, without further notice or formal proceeding, issue and enter the following Order:

ORDER

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that Physician's and Surgeon's Certificate No. G 42547, issued to Respondent MARC FRANK LIEBERMAN, M.D., is surrendered and accepted by the Board.

- 1. Respondent shall lose all rights and privileges as a physician and surgeon in California as of the effective date of the Board's Decision and Order.
- 2. Respondent shall cause to be delivered to the Board his pocket license and, if one was issued, his wall certificate on or before the effective date of the Decision and Order.
- 3. If Respondent ever files an application for licensure or a petition for reinstatement in the State of California, the Board shall treat it as a petition for reinstatement. Respondent must comply with all the laws, regulations and procedures for reinstatement of a revoked or

surrendered license in effect at the time the petition is filed, and all of the charges and allegations contained in Accusation No. 800-2017-032796 shall be deemed to be true, correct and admitted by Respondent when the Board determines whether to grant or deny the petition.

4. If Respondent should ever apply or reapply for a new license or certification, or petition for reinstatement of a license, by any other health care licensing agency in the State of California, all of the charges and allegations contained in Accusation, No. 800-2017-032796 shall be deemed to be true, correct, and admitted by Respondent for the purpose of any Statement of Issues or any other proceeding seeking to deny or restrict licensure.

ACCEPTANCE

I have carefully read the above Stipulated Surrender of License and Order and have fully discussed it with my attorney Brock D. Phillips, Esq. I understand the stipulation and the effect it will have on my Physician's and Surgeon's Certificate. I enter into this Stipulated Surrender of License and Order voluntarily, knowingly, and intelligently, and agree to be bound by the Decision and Order of the Medical Board of California.

JURISDICTION

- 3. This Accusation is brought before the Board, under the authority of the following laws. All section references are to the Business and Professions Code (Code) unless otherwise indicated.
 - 4. Section 2227 of the Code states:
 - (a) A licensee whose matter has been heard by an administrative law judge of the Medical Quality Hearing Panel as designated in Section 11371 of the Government Code, or whose default has been entered, and who is found guilty, or who has entered into a stipulation for disciplinary action with the board, may, in accordance with the provisions of this chapter:
 - (1) Have his or her license revoked upon order of the board.
 - (2) Have his or her right to practice suspended for a period not to exceed one year upon order of the board.
 - (3) Be placed on probation and be required to pay the costs of probation monitoring upon order of the board.
 - (4) Be publicly reprimanded by the board. The public reprimand may include a requirement that the licensee complete relevant educational courses approved by the board.
 - (5) Have any other action taken in relation to discipline as part of an order of probation, as the board or an administrative law judge may deem proper.
 - (b) Any matter heard pursuant to subdivision (a), except for warning letters, medical review or advisory conferences, professional competency examinations, continuing education activities, and cost reimbursement associated therewith that are agreed to with the board and successfully completed by the licensee, or other matters made confidential or privileged by existing law, is deemed public, and shall be made available to the public by the board pursuant to Section 803.1.
 - 5. Section 820 of the Code states:

Whenever it appears that any person holding a license, certificate or permit under this division or under any initiative act referred to in this division may be unable to practice his or her profession safely because the licentiate's ability to practice is impaired due to mental illness, or physical illness affecting competency, the licensing agency may order the licentiate to be examined by one or more physicians and surgeons or psychologists designated by the agency. The report of the examiners shall be made available to the licentiate and may be received as direct evidence in proceedings conducted pursuant to Section 822.

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6. Section 822 of the Code states:

If a licensing agency determines that its licentiate's ability to practice his or her profession safely is impaired because the licentiate is mentally ill, or physically ill affecting competency, the licensing agency may take action by any one of the following methods:

- (a) Revoking the licentiate's certificate or license.
- (b) Suspending the licentiate's right to practice.
- (c) Placing the licentiate on probation.
- (d) Taking such other action in relation to the licentiate as the licensing agency in its discretion deems proper.

The licensing section shall not reinstate a revoked or suspended certificate or license until it has received competent evidence of the absence or control of the condition which caused its action and until it is satisfied that with due regard for the public health and safety the person's right to practice his or her profession may be safely reinstated.

CAUSE FOR DISCIPLINE

(Section 822: Impairment)

- 7. Respondent Marc Frank Lieberman, M.D. is subject to disciplinary action under section 822 in that Respondent is unable to practice his profession safely, without certain restrictions and monitoring, due to a physical (neurological) condition, as described more fully herein.
- 8. On or about February 19, 2020, Respondent signed a Voluntary Agreement for Mental Evaluation by a Board-approved physician.
- 9. On or about March 16, 2020, Respondent was examined and evaluated by a Board-approved physician who is board-certified in psychiatry and neurology.
- 10. In a report dated May 1, 2020, the physician examiner diagnosed Respondent with a physical (neurological) condition, a mild neurocognitive disorder analogous to mild cognitive impairment (MCI) under the DSM-5, which requires certain restrictions and monitoring in order for Respondent to practice medicine safely. The physician examiner concluded that oversight and monitoring is necessary because there is a substantial likelihood of Respondent's cognitive deficits worsening, thereby further affecting Respondent's ability to practice medicine safely. The physician examiner recommended that Respondent have repeated physical/neurological

examinations at regular intervals, and that Respondent's patients' charts be audited at random intervals. Given Respondent's practice as an ophthalmologist and glaucoma specialist, the physician examiner further recommended that Respondent not perform any surgical procedures or any non-surgical interventions that are complex enough to require similar skills and/or decision-making as surgical procedures. The Board's physician examiner concluded that Respondent is currently able to engage in the general practice of medicine safely, if the recommended restrictions and conditions are implemented.

PRAYER

WHEREFORE, Complainant requests that a hearing be held on the matters herein alleged, and that following the hearing, the Medical Board of California issue a decision:

- 1. Revoking or suspending Physician's and Surgeon's Certificate Number G 42547, issued to Marc Frank Lieberman, M.D.;
- 2. Revoking, suspending or denying approval of Marc Frank Lieberman, M.D.'s authority to supervise physician assistants and advanced practice nurses;
- 3. Ordering Marc Frank Lieberman, M.D., if placed on probation, to pay the Board the costs of probation monitoring; and
 - 4. Taking such other and further action as deemed necessary and proper.
