
DECISION

20 **PARTIES**

21 1. William Prasifka (Complainant) is the Executive Director of the Medical Board of
22 California (Board). He brought this action solely in his official capacity and is represented in this
23 matter by Xavier Becerra, Attorney General of the State of California, by Lynne K. Dombrowski,
24 Deputy Attorney General.

25 2. MARC FRANK LIEBERMAN, M.D. (Respondent) is represented in this proceeding

1 surrendered license in effect at the time the petition is filed, and all of the charges and allegations

8 Issues or any other proceeding seeking to deny or restrict licensure.

9 **ACCEPTANCE**

ACCUSATION

15 Physician's and Surgeon's Certificate

19 **PARTIES**

20 1. Christine J. Lally (Complainant) brings this Accusation solely in her official capacity
21 as the Interim Executive Director of the Medical Board of California, Department of Consumer
22 Affairs (Board).

23 2. On or about July 14, 1980, the Medical Board issued Physician's and Surgeon's
24 Certificate Number G 42547 to Marc Frank Lieberman, M.D. (Respondent). The Physician's and
25 Surgeon's Certificate was in full force and effect at all times relevant to the charges brought
26 herein and will expire on July 31, 2020, unless renewed.

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1 JURISDICTION

2 3. This Accusation is brought before the Board, under the authority of the following
3 laws. All section references are to the Business and Professions Code (Code) unless otherwise
4 indicated.

5 4. Section 2227 of the Code states:

6 (a) A licensee whose matter has been heard by an administrative law judge of
7 the Medical Quality Hearing Panel as designated in Section 11371 of the Government
8 Code, or whose default has been entered, and who is found guilty, or who has entered
9 into a stipulation for disciplinary action with the board, may, in accordance with the
10 provisions of this chapter:

11 (1) Have his or her license revoked upon order of the board.

12 (2) Have his or her right to practice suspended for a period not to exceed one
13 year upon order of the board.

14 (3) Be placed on probation and be required to pay the costs of probation
15 monitoring upon order of the board.

16 (4) Be publicly reprimanded by the board. The public reprimand may include a
17 requirement that the licensee complete relevant educational courses approved by the
18 board.

19 (5) Have any other action taken in relation to discipline as part of an order of
20 probation, as the board or an administrative law judge may deem proper.

21 (b) Any matter heard pursuant to subdivision (a), except for warning letters,
22 medical review or advisory conferences, professional competency examinations,
23 continuing education activities, and cost reimbursement associated therewith that are
24 agreed to with the board and successfully completed by the licensee, or other matters
25 made confidential or privileged by existing law, is deemed public, and shall be made
26 available to the public by the board pursuant to Section 803.1.

27 5. Section 820 of the Code states:

28 Whenever it appears that any person holding a license, certificate or permit
under this division or under any initiative act referred to in this division may be
unable to practice his or her profession safely because the licentiate's ability to
practice is impaired due to mental illness, or physical illness affecting competency,
the licensing agency may order the licentiate to be examined by one or more
physicians and surgeons or psychologists designated by the agency. The report of the
examiners shall be made available to the licentiate and may be received as direct
evidence in proceedings conducted pursuant to Section 822.

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1 6. Section 822 of the Code states:

2 If a licensing agency determines that its licentiate's ability to practice his or her
3 profession safely is impaired because the licentiate is mentally ill, or physically ill
4 affecting competency, the licensing agency may take action by any one of the
5 following methods:

6 (a) Revoking the licentiate's certificate or license.

7 (b) Suspending the licentiate's right to practice.

8 (c) Placing the licentiate on probation.

9 (d) Taking such other action in relation to the licentiate as the licensing agency
10 in its discretion deems proper.

11 The licensing section shall not reinstate a revoked or suspended certificate or
12 license until it has received competent evidence of the absence or control of the
13 condition which caused its action and until it is satisfied that with due regard for the
14 public health and safety the person's right to practice his or her profession may be
15 safely reinstated.

16 CAUSE FOR DISCIPLINE

17 (Section 822: Impairment)

18 7. Respondent Marc Frank Lieberman, M.D. is subject to disciplinary action under
19 section 822 in that Respondent is unable to practice his profession safely, without certain
20 restrictions and monitoring, due to a physical (neurological) condition, as described more fully
21 herein.

22 8. On or about February 19, 2020, Respondent signed a Voluntary Agreement for
23 Mental Evaluation by a Board-approved physician.

24 9. On or about March 16, 2020, Respondent was examined and evaluated by a Board-
25 approved physician who is board-certified in psychiatry and neurology.

26 10. In a report dated May 1, 2020, the physician examiner diagnosed Respondent with a
27 physical (neurological) condition, a mild neurocognitive disorder analogous to mild cognitive
28 impairment (MCI) under the DSM-5, which requires certain restrictions and monitoring in order
 for Respondent to practice medicine safely. The physician examiner concluded that oversight and
 monitoring is necessary because there is a substantial likelihood of Respondent's cognitive
 deficits worsening, thereby further affecting Respondent's ability to practice medicine safely.
 The physician examiner recommended that Respondent have repeated physical/neurological


1 examinations at regular intervals, and that Respondent's patients' charts be audited at random
2 intervals. Given Respondent's practice as an ophthalmologist and glaucoma specialist, the
3 physician examiner further recommended that Respondent not perform any surgical procedures or
4 any non-surgical interventions that are complex enough to require similar skills and/or decision-
5 making as surgical procedures. The Board's physician examiner concluded that Respondent is
6 currently able to engage in the general practice of medicine safely, if the recommended
7 restrictions and conditions are implemented.

8 **PRAYER**

9 WHEREFORE, Complainant requests that a hearing be held on the matters herein alleged,
10 and that following the hearing, the Medical Board of California issue a decision:

- 11 1. Revoking or suspending Physician's and Surgeon's Certificate Number G 42547,
12 issued to Marc Frank Lieberman, M.D.;
- 13 2. Revoking, suspending or denying approval of Marc Frank Lieberman, M.D.'s
14 authority to supervise physician assistants and advanced practice nurses;
- 15 3. Ordering Marc Frank Lieberman, M.D., if placed on probation, to pay the Board the
16 costs of probation monitoring; and
- 17 4. Taking such other and further action as deemed necessary and proper.
