
DECISION

**STIPULATED SURRENDER OF
LICENSE AND ORDER**

18 IT IS HEREBY STIPULATED AND AGREED by and between the parties to the above-
19 entitled proceedings that the following matters are true:

20 **PARTIES**

21 1. William Prasifka (Complainant) is the Executive Director of the Medical Board of
22 California (Board). He brought this action solely in his official capacity and is represented in this
23 matter by Rob Bonta, Attorney General of the State of California, by Latrice R. Hemphill, Deputy
24 Attorney General.

25 2. ROSE CARMEN MALY, M.D. (Respondent) is representing herself in this
26 proceeding and has chosen not to exercise her right to be represented by counsel.

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3. On or about August 29, 1977, the Board issued Physician's and Surgeon's Certificate No. G 35390 to Respondent. The Physician's and Surgeon's Certificate was in full force and effect at all times relevant to the charges brought in Accusation No. 800-2020-068183 and expired on February 28, 2022.

JURISDICTION

4. Accusation No. 800-2020-068183 was filed before the Board, and is currently pending against Respondent. The Accusation and all other statutorily required documents were properly served on Respondent on October 26, 2021. Respondent timely filed her Notice of Defense contesting the Accusation. A copy of Accusation No. 800-2020-068183 is attached as Exhibit A and incorporated by reference.

ADVISEMENT AND WAIVERS

5. Respondent has carefully read, and understands the charges and allegations in Accusation No. 800-2020-068183. Respondent also has carefully read, and understands the effects of this Stipulated Surrender of License and Order.

6. Respondent is fully aware of her legal rights in this matter, including the right to a hearing on the charges and allegations in the Accusation; the right to be represented by counsel, at her own expense; the right to confront and cross-examine the witnesses against her; the right to present evidence and to testify on her own behalf; the right to the issuance of subpoenas to compel the attendance of witnesses and the production of documents; the right to reconsideration and court review of an adverse decision; and all other rights accorded by the California Administrative Procedure Act and other applicable laws.

7. Respondent voluntarily, knowingly, and intelligently waives and gives up each and every right set forth above.

CULPABILITY

8. Respondent understands that by signing this stipulation she enables the Board to issue an order accepting the surrender of her Physician's and Surgeon's Certificate without further process.

CONTINGENCY

9. This stipulation shall be subject to approval by the Board. Respondent understands and agrees that counsel for Complainant and the staff of the Board may communicate directly with the Board regarding this stipulation and surrender, without notice to or participation by Respondent. By signing the stipulation, Respondent understands and agrees that she may not withdraw her agreement or seek to rescind the stipulation prior to the time the Board considers and acts upon it. If the Board fails to adopt this stipulation as its Decision and Order, the Stipulated Surrender and Disciplinary Order shall be of no force or effect, except for this paragraph, it shall be inadmissible in any legal action between the parties, and the Board shall not be disqualified from further action by having considered this matter.

10. The parties understand and agree that Portable Document Format (PDF) and facsimile copies of this Stipulated Surrender of License and Order, including PDF and facsimile signatures thereto, shall have the same force and effect as the originals.

11. In consideration of the foregoing admissions and stipulations, the parties agree that the Board may, without further notice or formal proceeding, issue and enter the following Order:

ORDER

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that Physician's and Surgeon's Certificate No. G 35390, issued to Respondent ROSE CARMEN MALY, M.D., is surrendered and accepted by the Board.

1. Respondent shall lose all rights and privileges as a Physician and Surgeon in California as of the effective date of the Board's Decision and Order.

2. Respondent shall cause to be delivered to the Board her pocket license and, if one was issued, her wall certificate on or before the effective date of the Decision and Order.

3. If she ever applies for licensure or petitions for reinstatement in the State of California, the Board shall treat it as a petition for reinstatement of a revoked license. Respondent must comply with all the laws, regulations and procedures for licensure in effect at the time the application or petition is filed, and all of the charges and allegations contained in Accusation No. 800-2020-068183 shall be deemed to be true, correct and admitted by Respondent when the Board determines whether to grant or deny the application or petition.

4. If Respondent should ever apply or reapply for a new license or certification, or petition for reinstatement of a license, by any other health care licensing agency in the State of California, all of the charges and allegations contained in Accusation, No. 800-2020-068183 shall be deemed to be true, correct, and admitted by Respondent for the purpose of any Statement of Issues or any other proceeding seeking to deny or restrict licensure.

ACCEPTANCE

I have carefully read the Stipulated Surrender of License and Order. I understand the stipulation and the effect it will have on my Physician's and Surgeon's Certificate. I enter into this Stipulated Surrender of License and Order voluntarily, knowingly, and intelligently, and agree to be bound by the Decision and Order of the Medical Board of California.

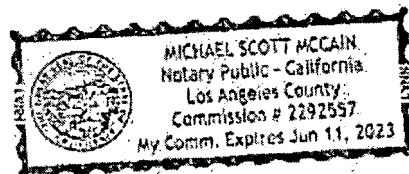

20 1. William Prasifka (Complainant) brings this Accusation solely in his official capacity
21 as the Executive Director of the Medical Board of California, Department of Consumer Affairs
22 (Board).

23 2. On or about August 29, 1977, the Board issued Physician's and Surgeon's Certificate
24 Number G 35390 to Rose Carmen Maly, M.D. (Respondent). The Physician's and Surgeon's
25 Certificate was in full force and effect at all times relevant to the charges brought herein and will
26 expire on February 28, 2022, unless renewed.

JURISDICTION

3. This Accusation is brought before the Board, under the authority of the following laws. All section references are to the Business and Professions Code (Code) unless otherwise indicated.

4. Section 2004 of the Code states:

The board shall have the responsibility for the following:

(a) The enforcement of the disciplinary and criminal provisions of the Medical Practice Act.

(b) The administration and hearing of disciplinary actions.

(c) Carrying out disciplinary actions appropriate to findings made by a panel or an administrative law judge.

(d) Suspending, revoking, or otherwise limiting certificates after the conclusion of disciplinary actions.

(e) Reviewing the quality of medical practice carried out by physician and surgeon certificate holders under the jurisdiction of the board.

(f) Approving undergraduate and graduate medical education programs.

(g) Approving clinical clerkship and special programs and hospitals for the programs in subdivision (f).

(h) Issuing licenses and certificates under the board's jurisdiction.

(i) Administering the board's continuing medical education program.

5. Section 820 of the Code states:

Whenever it appears that any person holding a license, certificate or permit under this division or under any initiative act referred to in this division may be unable to practice his or her profession safely because the licentiate's ability to practice is impaired due to mental illness, or physical illness affecting competency, the licensing agency may order the licentiate to be examined by one or more physicians and surgeons or psychologists designated by the agency. The report of the examiners shall be made available to the licentiate and may be received as direct evidence in proceedings conducted pursuant to Section 822.

6. Section 821 of the Code provides that the licentiate's failure to comply with an order issued under section 820 shall constitute grounds for the suspension or revocation of the licentiate's certificate or license.

FACTUAL ALLEGATIONS

7. On or about May 7, 2021, the Board issued an order pursuant to Business and Professions Code section 820, Case No. 800-2020-068183, compelling Respondent to undergo mental and physical examinations to determine whether she was impaired by a mental or physical illness affecting her competency to practice medicine.

8. On or about May 12, 2021, Investigator Legaspi contacted medical expert Grace Tassa, M.D. to perform a physical examination of Respondent. On or about May 14, 2021, Dr. Tassa agreed to administer the physical examination.

9. Additionally, on or about May 12, 2021, Investigator Legaspi contacted medical expert Manuel Saint Martin, M.D. Dr. Martin agreed to administer the mental examination.

10. On or about May 14, 2021, Investigator Legaspi contacted Respondent, by Certified U.S. Mail and e-mail, providing the contact information for each medical expert. Respondent was instructed to contact the experts and arrange an appointment no later than June 6, 2021.

11. On or about May 19, 2021, Supervising Investigator Gonzalez received a phone call from Respondent's sister, Maxine Maly (Maxine). Maxine indicated that Respondent sustained a traumatic head injury in April 2021, and Maxine had Power of Attorney over Respondent. Maxine provided the Power of Attorney documentation to Supervising Investigator Gonzalez.

12. On or about June 14, 2021, Investigator Legaspi received an e-mail from Maxine that included a letter from Respondent's neurosurgeon. The letter stated that Respondent sustained a brain injury and would be unable to testify or undergo testing until April 2022.

13. On or about September 10, 2021, Investigator Legaspi provided Maxine a Disabled Physician Application (DPA) for Respondent to complete and return, given her sustained injuries.

14. On or about September 16, 2021, Respondent called Investigator Legaspi and she indicated that she would not sign the DPA and she would not participate in the mental examination and physical examination.

15. On or about September 17, 2021, Maxine instructed Investigator Legaspi to speak with Respondent directly about his concerns.

1 **CAUSE FOR DISCIPLINE**

2 **(Failure to Obey Board Order Compelling Mental and Physical Exam)**


3 16. By reason of the facts set forth in paragraphs 7 through 15, above, Respondent is
4 subject to disciplinary action under Code section 821 in that Respondent failed to comply with an
5 order issued under section 820 of the Code by failing to schedule and refusing to undergo mental
6 and physical examinations.

7 **PRAYER**

8 WHEREFORE, Complainant requests that a hearing be held on the matters herein alleged,
9 and that following the hearing, the Medical Board of California issue a decision:

- 10 1. Revoking or suspending Physician's and Surgeon's Certificate Number G 35390,
11 issued to Respondent Rose Carmen Maly, M.D.;
- 12 2. Revoking, suspending or denying approval of Respondent Rose Carmen Maly, M.D.'s
13 authority to supervise physician assistants and advanced practice nurses;
- 14 3. Ordering Respondent Rose Carmen Maly, M.D., if placed on probation, to pay the
15 Board the costs of probation monitoring; and
- 16 4. Taking such other and further action as deemed necessary and proper.
