18 IT IS HEREBY STIPULATED AND AGREED by and between the parties to the above-
19 entitled proceedings that the following matters are true:

20 **PARTIES**

21 1. William Prasifka (Complainant) is the Executive Director of the Medical Board of
22 California (Board). He brought this action solely in his official capacity and is represented in this
23 matter by Rob Bonta, Attorney General of the State of California, by Thomas Ostly, Deputy
24 Attorney General.

25 2. Que Anh Chu, M.D. (Respondent) is represented in this proceeding by attorney
26 Daniel Horowitz whose address is: P.O. Box 1547 Lafayette, CA 94549.

27 3. On or about October 14, 1986, the Board issued Physician's and Surgeon's Certificate
28 No. A 43191 to Que Anh Chu, M.D. (Respondent). The Physician's and Surgeon's Certificate

1 was in full force and effect at all times relevant to the charges brought in Accusation No. 800-
2 2019-055154 and will expire on October 31, 2022, unless renewed.

3 **JURISDICTION**

4 4. Accusation No. 800-2019-055154 was filed before the Board, and is currently
5 pending against Respondent. The Accusation and all other statutorily required documents were
6 properly served on Respondent on April 20, 2022. Respondent timely filed his Notice of Defense
7 contesting the Accusation. A copy of Accusation No. 800-2019-055154 is attached as Exhibit A
8 and incorporated by reference.

9 **ADVISEMENT AND WAIVERS**

10 5. Respondent has carefully read, fully discussed with counsel, and understands the
11 charges and allegations in Accusation No. 800-2019-055154. Respondent also has carefully read,
12 fully discussed with counsel, and understands the effects of this Stipulated Surrender of License
13 and Order.

14 6. Respondent is fully aware of his legal rights in this matter, including the right to a
15 hearing on the charges and allegations in the Accusation; the right to confront and cross-examine
16 the witnesses against him; the right to present evidence and to testify on his own behalf; the right
17 to the issuance of subpoenas to compel the attendance of witnesses and the production of
18 documents; the right to reconsideration and court review of an adverse decision; and all other
19 rights accorded by the California Administrative Procedure Act and other applicable laws.

20 7. Respondent voluntarily, knowingly, and intelligently waives and gives up each and
21 every right set forth above.

22 **CULPABILITY**

23 8. Respondent admits the truth of each and every charge and allegation in Accusation
24 No. 800-2019-055154, agrees that cause exists for discipline and hereby surrenders his
25 Physician's and Surgeon's Certificate No. A 43191 for the Board's formal acceptance.

26 9. Respondent understands that by signing this stipulation he enables the Board to issue
27 an order accepting the surrender of his Physician's and Surgeon's Certificate without further
28 process.

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1 admitted by Respondent when the Board determines whether to grant or deny the application or
2 petition.

3 4. Respondent shall pay the agency its costs of investigation and enforcement in the
4 amount of \$11,798.75 prior to issuance of a new or reinstated license.

5 5. If Respondent should ever apply or reapply for a new license or certification, or
6 petition for reinstatement of a license, by any other health care licensing agency in the State of
7 California, all of the charges and allegations contained in Accusation, No. 800-2019-055154 shall
8 be deemed to be true, correct, and admitted by Respondent for the purpose of any Statement of
9 Issues or any other proceeding seeking to deny or restrict licensure.

10 **ACCEPTANCE**

11 I have carefully read the above Stipulated Surrender of License and Order and have fully
12 discussed it with my attorney Daniel Horowitz. I understand the stipulation and the effect it will
13 have on my Physician's and Surgeon's Certificate. I enter into this Stipulated Surrender of
14 License and Order voluntarily, knowingly, and intelligently, and agree to be bound by the
15 Decision and Order of the Medical Board of California.

18 **PARTIES**

19 1. William Prasifka (Complainant) brings this Accusation solely in his official capacity
20 as the Executive Director of the Medical Board of California, Department of Consumer Affairs
21 (Board).

22 2. On or about October 14, 1986, the Medical Board issued Physician's and Surgeon's
23 Certificate Number A 43191 to Que Anh Chu, M.D. (Respondent). The Physician's and
24 Surgeon's Certificate was in full force and effect at all times relevant to the charges brought
25 herein. The certificate is currently inactive and will expire on October 31, 2022, unless renewed.
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1 **JURISDICTION**

2 3. This Accusation is brought before the Board, under the authority of the following
3 laws. All section references are to the Business and Professions Code (Code) unless otherwise
4 indicated.

5 **STATUTORY PROVISIONS**

6 4. Section 2234 of the Code, states, in pertinent part:

7 The board shall take action against any licensee who is charged with
8 unprofessional conduct. In addition to other provisions of this article, unprofessional
conduct includes, but is not limited to, the following:

9 (a) Violating or attempting to violate, directly or indirectly, assisting in or
10 abetting the violation of, or conspiring to violate any provision of this chapter.

11 (b) Gross negligence.

12 (c) Repeated negligent acts. To be repeated, there must be two or more
13 negligent acts or omissions. An initial negligent act or omission followed by a
separate and distinct departure from the applicable standard of care shall constitute
repeated negligent acts.

14 (d) Incompetence

15 (e) The commission of any act involving dishonesty or corruption that is
16 substantially related to the qualifications, functions or duties of a physician and surgeon.

17 **COST RECOVERY**

18 5. Section 125.3 of the Code provides, in pertinent part, that the Board may request the
19 administrative law judge to direct a licensee found to have committed a violation or violations of
20 the licensing act to pay a sum not to exceed the reasonable costs of the investigation and
21 enforcement of the case, with failure of the licensee to comply subjecting the license to not being
22 renewed or reinstated. If a case settles, recovery of investigation and enforcement costs may be
23 included in a stipulated settlement.

24 **FIRST CAUSE FOR DISCIPLINE**

25 (Gross Negligence/Repeated Negligent Acts/Incompetence/Dishonesty)

26 6. uBiome, Inc. was a biotechnology company based in San Francisco, CA that
27 developed technology to sequence the human microbiome. Its main product, a "SmartGut" test,
28 analyzed gut microbes in patients.

1 7. Staff Care, a unit of AMN Healthcare, provided the physician staffing to uBiome
2 starting in 2017, and doctors were paid to approve uBiome tests.

3 8. In July, 2018 Respondent began working for AMN Healthcare, in the Staff Care unit.
4 His job duties including preordering stool studies for patients who sent in their stool specimens
5 for "SmartGut" testing to be performed by uBiome. The decision to order tests was based on
6 patients filling out an online checklist of symptoms. There was no verification of these symptoms,
7 further history or physical exam, or any direct communication with the patients prior to ordering
8 tests.

9 9. Respondent relied solely on the online checklist to order tests. Respondent ordered
10 expensive test kits (\$2,970.00 per kit) sometimes up to six kits per patient. Respondent also
11 ordered retesting of specimens without consultation with patients.

12 10. Patients were informed by uBiome there would be no charge to them for SmartGut
13 testing, as payments could be used towards a patient's insurance deductible, without the patient
14 spending their own money.

15 11. Respondent has no background in Microbiology, Infectious Diseases, Genetics or
16 Intestinal Medicine. Prior to July 2018, his training was in Pediatrics and Anesthesia. During the
17 time he ordered tests for uBiome, Respondent was not board certified in any specialty and had no
18 active hospital privileges.

19 13. As an example of Respondent's involvement in uBiome, on October 24, 2017 a
20 SmartGut test was ordered by uBiome for a patient who later filed a complaint with the
21 Department of Consumer Affairs. The results of the test were normal. Respondent ordered
22 additional tests for Patient, including the retesting of samples. Respondent failed to examine or
23 interact directly Patient prior to ordering the laboratory tests. Respondent permitted his name and
24 medical license to be used to preauthorize tests for Patient. After three normal tests, the fourth
25 test was denied coverage by Patient's insurance carrier. Respondent never had any interaction
26 with Patient before ordering the tests, after the testing was sent in, or after the results were
27 returned.

1 15. Respondent is guilty of unprofessional conduct and Respondent's certificate is subject
2 to discipline pursuant to Sections 2234 and/or 2234(b) and/or 2234(c) and/or 2234(d) and/or
3 2234(e) of the Code based upon gross negligence and/or repeated negligent acts, and/or
4 incompetence and/or dishonest or corrupt acts as follows:


- 5 a. Respondent repeatedly ordering tests without any exam or consultation with patients
6 b. Respondent repeatedly ordered tests for patients, without any medical indication,
7 c. Respondent repeatedly ordered tests for patients, without knowledge or training as the
8 validity or purpose of the tests, or whether there was any medical indication for the tests
9 d. Respondent repeatedly facilitated the submission of false insurance claims.

11 **PRAYER**

12 WHEREFORE, Complainant requests that a hearing be held on the matters herein alleged,
13 and that following the hearing, the Medical Board of California issue a decision:

- 14 1. Revoking or suspending Physician's and Surgeon's Certificate Number A 43191,
15 issued to Que Anh Chu, M.D.;
- 16 2. Revoking, suspending or denying approval of Que Anh Chu, M.D.'s authority to
17 supervise physician assistants and advanced practice nurses;
- 18 3. Ordering respondent, Que Anh Chu, M.D, to pay the Board the costs of the
19 investigation and enforcement of this and, if placed on probation, to pay the Board the costs of
20 probation monitoring; and
- 21 4. Taking such other and further action as deemed necessary and proper.
