## **JURISDICTION**

4. Accusation No. 800-2020-065801 was filed before the Board on March 16, 2023, and is currently pending against Respondent. The Accusation and all other statutorily required documents were properly served on Respondent. Respondent timely filed his Notice of Defense contesting the Accusation. A copy of Accusation No. 800-2020-065801 is attached as Exhibit A and incorporated by reference.

## ADVISEMENT AND WAIVERS

- 5. Respondent has carefully read, fully discussed with counsel, and understands the charges and allegations in Accusation No. 800-2020-065801. Respondent also has carefully read, fully discussed with counsel, and understands the effects of this Stipulated Surrender of License and Order.
- 6. Respondent is fully aware of his legal rights in this matter, including the right to a hearing on the charges and allegations in the Accusation; the right to confront and cross-examine the witnesses against him; the right to present evidence and to testify on his own behalf; the right to the issuance of subpoenas to compel the attendance of witnesses and the production of documents; the right to reconsideration and court review of an adverse decision; and all other rights accorded by the California Administrative Procedure Act and other applicable laws.
- 7. Respondent voluntarily, knowingly, and intelligently waives and gives up each and every right set forth above.

## **CULPABILITY**

- 8. Respondent understands that the charges and allegations in Accusation No. 800-2020-065801, if proven at a hearing, constitute cause for imposing discipline upon his Physician's and Surgeon's Certificate.
- 9. For the purpose of resolving the Accusation without the expense and uncertainty of further proceedings, Respondent agrees that, at a hearing, Complainant could establish a factual basis for the charges in the Accusation and that those charges constitute cause for discipline.

Respondent hereby gives up his right to contest that cause for discipline exists based on those charges.

10. Respondent understands that by signing this stipulation he enables the Board to issue an order accepting the surrender of his Physician's and Surgeon's Certificate without further process.

## **CONTINGENCY**

- 11. This stipulation shall be subject to approval by the Board. Respondent understands and agrees that counsel for Complainant and the staff of the Board may communicate directly with the Board regarding this stipulation and surrender, without notice to or participation by Respondent or his counsel. By signing the stipulation, Respondent understands and agrees that he may not withdraw his agreement or seek to rescind the stipulation prior to the time the Board considers and acts upon it. If the Board fails to adopt this stipulation as its Decision and Order, the Stipulated Surrender and Disciplinary Order shall be of no force or effect, except for this paragraph, it shall be inadmissible in any legal action between the parties, and the Board shall not be disqualified from further action by having considered this matter.
- 12. This Stipulated Surrender of License and Order is intended by the parties herein to be an integrated writing representing the complete, final and exclusive embodiment of the agreement of the parties in this above entitled matter.
- 13. The parties understand and agree that Portable Document Format (PDF) and facsimile copies of this Stipulated Surrender of License and Order, including PDF and facsimile signatures thereto, shall have the same force and effect as the originals.
- 14. In consideration of the foregoing admissions and stipulations, the parties agree that the Board may, without further notice or formal proceeding, issue and enter the following Order:

## **ORDER**

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that Physician's and Surgeon's Certificate No. C 38214, issued to Respondent Harvey Lyons, M.D., is surrendered and accepted by the Board.

1. The surrender of Respondent's Physician's and Surgeon's Certificate and the acceptance of the surrendered license by the Board shall constitute the imposition of discipline

against Respondent. This stipulation constitutes a record of the discipline and shall become a part of Respondent's license history with the Board.

- 2. Respondent shall lose all rights and privileges as a physician and surgeon in California as of the effective date of the Board's Decision and Order.
- 3. Respondent shall cause to be delivered to the Board his pocket license and, if one was issued, his wall certificate on or before the effective date of the Decision and Order.
- 4. If Respondent ever files an application for licensure or a petition for reinstatement in the State of California, the Board shall treat it as a petition for reinstatement. Respondent must comply with all the laws, regulations and procedures for reinstatement of a revoked or surrendered license in effect at the time the petition is filed, and all of the charges and allegations contained in Accusation No. 800-2020-065801 shall be deemed to be true, correct and admitted by Respondent when the Board determines whether to grant or deny the petition.
- 5. Respondent shall pay the agency its costs of investigation and enforcement in the amount of \$35,302.50 prior to issuance of a new or reinstated license.
- 6. If Respondent should ever apply or reapply for a new license or certification, of petition for reinstatement of a license, by any other health care licensing agency in the State of California, all of the charges and allegations contained in Accusation No. 800-2020-065801 shall be deemed to be true, correct, and admitted by Respondent for the purpose of any Statement of Issues or any other proceeding seeking to deny or restrict licensure:

# ACCEPTANCE

I understand the stipulation and the effect it will have on my Physician's and Surgeon's Certificate. 4. Section 2004 of the Code states:

The board shall have the responsibility for the following:

- (a) The enforcement of the disciplinary and criminal provisions of the Medical Practice Act.
  - (b) The administration and hearing of disciplinary actions.
- (c) Carrying out disciplinary actions appropriate to findings made by a panel or an administrative law judge.
- (d) Suspending, revoking, or otherwise limiting certificates after the conclusion of disciplinary actions.
- (e) Reviewing the quality of medical practice carried out by physician and surgeon certificate holders under the jurisdiction of the board.
  - (f) Approving undergraduate and graduate medical education programs.
- (g) Approving clinical clerkship and special programs and hospitals for the programs in subdivision (f).
  - (h) Issuing licenses and certificates under the board's jurisdiction.
  - (i) Administering the board's continuing medical education program.

#### 5. Section 2220 of the Code states:

Except as otherwise provided by law, the board may take action against all persons guilty of violating this chapter. The board shall enforce and administer this article as to physician and surgeon certificate holders, including those who hold certificates that do not permit them to practice medicine, such as, but not limited to, retired, inactive, or disabled status certificate holders, and the board shall have all the powers granted in this chapter for these purposes including, but not limited to:

- (a) Investigating complaints from the public, from other licensees, from health care facilities, or from the board that a physician and surgeon may be guilty of unprofessional conduct. The board shall investigate the circumstances underlying a report received pursuant to Section 805 or 805.01 within 30 days to determine if an interim suspension order or temporary restraining order should be issued. The board shall otherwise provide timely disposition of the reports received pursuant to Section 805 and Section 805.01.
- (b) Investigating the circumstances of practice of any physician and surgeon where there have been any judgments, settlements, or arbitration awards requiring the physician and surgeon or his or her professional liability insurer to pay an amount in damages in excess of a cumulative total of thirty thousand dollars (\$30,000) with respect to any claim that injury or damage was proximately caused by the physician's and surgeon's error, negligence, or omission.
- (c) Investigating the nature and causes of injuries from cases which shall be reported of a high number of judgments, settlements, or arbitration awards against a physician and surgeon.

COST RECOVERY

9. Section 125.3 of the Code provides, in pertinent part, that the Board may request the administrative law judge to direct a licensee found to have committed a violation or violations of the licensing act to pay a sum not to exceed the reasonable costs of the investigation and enforcement of the case, with failure of the licensee to comply subjecting the license to not being renewed or reinstated. If a case settles, recovery of investigation and enforcement costs may be included in a stipulated settlement.

## FACTUAL ALLEGATIONS

10. Respondent is currently retired from the practice of medicine. Prior to his retirement he specialized in chronic pain management. Respondent was board certified in internal medicine and nephrology.

## Standard of Care

- 11. When prescribing controlled substances for pain, the standard of care calls for the physician to identify a medical indication for the controlled substance, perform a history and physical examination, formulate a treatment plan which includes medical and functional objectives, nonpharmacologic and rehabilitation programs if indicated. Non-opioid pain management should be exhausted before opioid therapy is started. Periodic review of the treatment plan and goals, opiate tapering, CURES review, urine testing and a pain management agreement should be signed. Prior to starting opioid therapy, an opiate harm assessment should be completed to assess the patient for the risk of opiate abuse or aberrant drug related behavior.
- 12. The standard of care also calls for the physician to keep accurate and complete records, including a medical history, psychiatric history, medications, physical examinations, consultations, prior management, diagnostic studies, current assessment, and treatment plan.

#### Patient 11

13. Respondent provided treatment to Patient 1 at Saviers CFS (Community Memorial Health Center-Saviers Road) in Ventura, California, for complaints of chronic pain. Patient 1, age 33 at the time, had a history of chronic pain syndrome, back pain with radiculopathy,

fibromyalgia, migraine headaches, obesity, PCOS (polycystic ovary syndrome), diabetes, bipolar disorder, previous suicide attempt, and hypothyroidism.

- 14. According to CURES,<sup>2</sup> Respondent prescribed Oxycodone, Clonazepam,
  Buprenophine, Morphine, and Lyrica to Patient 1 between on or about March 7, 2018 and August
  1, 2021, without conducting a complete harm assessment on her and/or documenting that he did
  so.
- 15. Patient 1 was at high risk for a poor outcome on opioid therapy due to her long-term treatment with opioids, bipolar disorder, prior suicide attempt, multiple psychiatric medications, and a positive urine drug screen for marijuana. Due to Patient 1 being at high risk for a poor outcome on opioid therapy, the failure to complete and/or document an opioid harm assessment could have led to controlled substance misuse, adverse drug reactions, drug abuse, and overdose.

### Patient 2

- 16. Respondent provided treatment to Patient 2 at Saviers CFS in Ventura, California, for complaints of chronic pain. Patient 2, age 58 at the time, had a history of bronchitis, back pain, bipolar disorder, chronic pain syndrome, diabetes with retinopathy, neuropathy, GERD (gastroesophageal reflux disease), falls, hypertension, morbid obesity, and restless leg syndrome.
- 17. According to CURES, Respondent prescribed Norco to Patient 2 between on or about July 23, 2019 and July 15, 2021, without conducting a complete harm assessment on her and/or documenting that he did so.
- 18. Patient 2 was at high risk for a poor outcome due her bipolar disorder, concurrent treatment with multiple psychotropic agents, and positive urine drug screens for marijuana and other opiate medications. The failure to complete and/or document a harm assessment could have led to controlled substance misuse, adverse drug reactions, drug abuse, and overdose.
