20	IT IS HEREBY STIPULATED AND AGREED by and between the parties to the above-		
21	entitled proceedings that the following matters are true:		
22	<u>PARTIES</u>		
23	1. Reji Varghese (Complainant) is the Executive Director of the Medical Board of		
24	California (Board). He brought this action solely in his official capacity and is represented in thi		
25	matter by Rob Bonta, Attorney General of the State of California, by LeAnna E. Shields, Deputy		
26	Attorney General.		
27	2. Ian Dallas Brodie, M.D. (Respondent) is representing himself in this proceeding and		
28	has chosen not to exercise his right to be represented by counsel.

- 3. On or about December 8, 1975, the Board issued Physician's and Surgeon's Certificate No. A 29773 to Respondent. That license was in full force and effect at all times relevant to the charges brought in Accusation No. 800-2023-097589 and will expire on April 30, 2024, unless renewed.
- 4. On or about November 15, 2023, an Interim Suspension Order was issued pursuant to Government Code section 11529 which suspended Respondent's ability to practice medicine. On or about December 5, 2023, the Interim Suspension Order was upheld pending a final resolution of Accusation No. 800-2023-097589 pending before the Board. The Interim Suspension Order remains in full force and effect as of the effective date of this Stipulated Surrender and Order.

JURISDICTION

5. On December 19, 2023, Accusation No. 800-2023-097589 was filed before the Board, and is currently pending against Respondent. On December 19, 2023, a true and correct copy of Accusation No. 800-2023-097589 and all other statutorily required documents were properly served on Respondent. A true and correct copy of Accusation No. 800-2023-097589 is attached hereto as Exhibit A and incorporated by reference as if fully set forth herein.

ADVISEMENT AND WAIVERS

- 6. Respondent has carefully read, and fully understands the charges and allegations in Accusation No. 800-2023-097589. Respondent also has carefully read, and fully understands the effects of this Stipulated Surrender of License and Order.
- 7. Respondent is fully aware of his legal rights in this matter, including the right to a hearing on the charges and allegations in the Accusation; the right to be represented by counsel, at his own expense; the right to confront and cross-examine the witnesses against him; the right to present evidence and to testify on his own behalf; the right to the issuance of subpoenas to compel the attendance of witnesses and the production of documents; the right to reconsideration and court review of an adverse decision; and all other rights accorded by the California Administrative Procedure Act and other applicable laws.
- 8. Respondent voluntarily, knowingly, and intelligently waives and gives up each and every right set forth above.

CULPABILITY

- 9. Respondent admits the truth of each and every charge and allegation in Accusation No. 800-2023-097589, agrees that cause for action exists and hereby surrenders his Physician's and Surgeon's Certificate No. A 29773 for the Board's formal acceptance.
- 10. Respondent understands that by signing this stipulation he enables the Board to issue an order accepting the surrender of his Physician's and Surgeon's Certificate without further process.

CONTINGENCY

- 11. Business and Professions Code section 2224, subdivision (b), provides, in pertinent part, that the Medical Board "shall delegate to its executive director the authority to adopt a ... stipulation for surrender of a license."
- 12. Respondent understands that, by signing this stipulation, he enables the Executive Director of the Board to issue an order, on behalf of the Board, accepting the surrender of his Physician's and Surgeon's Certificate No. A 29773 without further notice to, or opportunity to be heard by, Respondent.
- 13. This Stipulated Surrender of License and Order shall be subject to the approval of the Executive Director on behalf of the Board. The parties agree that this Stipulated Surrender of License and Order shall be submitted to the Executive Director for his consideration in the above-entitled matter and, further, that the Executive Director shall have a reasonable period of time in which to consider and act on this Stipulated Surrender of License and Order after receiving it. By signing this stipulation, Respondent fully understands and agrees that he may not withdraw his agreement or seek to rescind this stipulation prior to the time the Executive Director, on behalf of the Medical Board, considers and acts upon it.
- 14. The parties agree that this Stipulated Surrender of License and Order shall be null and void and not binding upon the parties unless approved and adopted by the Executive Director on behalf of the Board, except for this paragraph, which shall remain in full force and effect.

 Respondent fully understands and agrees that in deciding whether or not to approve and adopt this Stipulated Surrender of License and Order, the Executive Director and/or the Board may receive

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oral and written communications from its staff and/or the Attorney General's Office.

Communications pursuant to this paragraph shall not disqualify the Executive Director, the Board, any member thereof, and/or any other person from future participation in this or any other matter affecting or involving Respondent. In the event that the Executive Director on behalf of the Board does not, in his discretion, approve and adopt this Stipulated Surrender of License and Order, with the exception of this paragraph, it shall not become effective, shall be of no evidentiary value whatsoever, and shall not be relied upon or introduced in any action by either party hereto. Respondent further agrees that should this Stipulated Surrender of License and Order be rejected for any reason by the Executive Director on behalf of the Board, Respondent will assert no claim that the Executive Director, the Board, or any member thereof, was prejudiced by its/his/her review, discussion and/or consideration of this Stipulated Surrender of License and Order or of any matter or matters related hereto.

ADDITIONAL PROVISIONS

- 15. This Stipulated Surrender of License and Order is intended by the parties herein to be an integrated writing representing the complete, final and exclusive embodiment of the agreements of the parties in the above-entitled matter.
- 16. The parties agree that copies of this Stipulated Surrender of License and Order, including copies of the signatures of the parties, may be used in lieu of original documents and signatures and, further, that such copies shall have the same force and effect as originals.
- 17. In consideration of the foregoing admissions and stipulations, the parties agree the Executive Director of the Board may, without further notice to or opportunity to be heard by Respondent, issue and enter the following Order on behalf of the Board:

ORDER

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that Physician's and Surgeon's Certificate No. A 29773, issued to Respondent Ian Dallas Brodie, M.D., is hereby surrendered and accepted by the Board.

1. This stipulation shall become a part of Respondent's license history with the Medical Board of California.

- 2. Respondent shall lose all rights and privileges as a physician and surgeon in California as of the effective date of the Board's Decision and Order.
- 3. Respondent shall cause to be delivered to the Board his pocket license and, if one was issued, his wall certificate on or before the effective date of the Decision and Order.
- 4. As required by Business and Professions Code section 823, reinstatement of respondent's Physician's and Surgeon's Certificate No. A 29773 shall be governed by the procedures in Article 12.5 of Chapter 1 of Division 2 of the Code.
- 5. If Respondent ever files an application for licensure or a petition for reinstatement in the State of California, the Board shall treat it as a petition for reinstatement. Respondent must comply with all the laws, regulations and procedures for reinstatement of a revoked and/or surrendered license in effect at the time the petition is filed, and all of the charges and allegations contained in Accusation No. 800-2023-097589 shall be deemed to be true, correct and fully admitted by Respondent when the Board determines whether to grant or deny the petition.
- 6. If Respondent should ever apply or reapply for a new license or certification, or petition for reinstatement of a license, by any other health care licensing agency in the State of California, all of the charges and allegations contained in Accusation No. 800-2023-097589 shall be deemed to be true, correct, and fully admitted by Respondent for the purpose of any Statement of Issues or any other proceeding seeking to deny or restrict licensure.

ACCEPTANCE

I have carefully read the Stipulated Surrender of License and Order. I fully understand the stipulation and the effect it will have on my Physician's and Surgeon's Certificate No. A 29773. I enter into this Stipulated Surrender of License and Order voluntarily, knowingly, and intelligently, and agree to be bound by the Decision and Order of the Medical Board of California.

22	1. Reji Varghese (Complainant) brings this Accusation solely in his official capacity as		
23	the Executive Director of the Medical Board of California, Department of Consumer Affairs

25	2. On or about December 8, 1975, the	Medical Board issued Physician's and Surgeon's	
26	Certificate No. A 29773 to Ian Dallas Brodie, M.D. (Respondent). The Physician's and		
27	Surgeon's Certificate was in full force and effect at all times relevant to the charges brought

- 3. On or about November 15, 2023, an ex parte interim order of suspension was imposed restricting Respondent from practicing medicine.
- 4. On or about December 5, 2023, the interim order of suspension was upheld pending a final resolution of the instant matter pending before the Board.

JURISDICTION

- 5. This Accusation is brought before the Board, under the authority of the following laws. All section references are to the Business and Professions Code (Code) unless otherwise indicated.
 - 6. Section 820 of the Code states:

Whenever it appears that any person holding a license, certificate or permit under this division or under any initiative act referred to in this division may be unable to practice his or her profession safely because the licentiate's ability to practice is impaired due to mental illness, or physical illness affecting competency, the licensing agency may order the licentiate to be examined by one or more physicians and surgeons or psychologists designated by the agency. The report of the examiners shall be made available to the licentiate and may be received as direct evidence in proceedings conducted pursuant to Section 822.

7. Section 822 of the Code states:

If a licensing agency determines that its licentiate's ability to practice his or her profession safely is impaired because the licentiate is mentally ill, or physically ill affecting competency, the licensing agency may take action by any one of the following methods:

- (a) Revoking the licentiate's certificate or license.
- (b) Suspending the licentiate's right to practice.
- (c) Placing the licentiate on probation.
- (d) Taking such other action in relation to the licentiate as the licensing agency in its discretion deems proper.

The licensing section shall not reinstate a revoked or suspended certificate or license until it has received competent evidence of the absence or control of the condition which caused its action and until it is satisfied that with due regard for the public health and safety the person's right to practice his or her profession may be safely reinstated.

8. Section 2220 of the Code states, in pertinent part, "Except as otherwise provided by law, the board may take action against all persons guilty of violating this chapter. The board shall enforce and administer this article as to physician and surgeon certificate holders..."

CAUSE FOR ACTION

(Mental and/or Physical Condition Affecting Competency)

- 9. Respondent's Physician's and Surgeon's Certificate No. A 29773 is subject to action under section 822 of the Code, in that his ability to practice medicine safely is impaired due to a mental and/or physical condition affecting competency, as more particularly alleged hereinafter.
- 10. On or about July 13, 2023, Respondent agreed to undergo a voluntary mental and physical evaluation by Board appointed physicians.
- 11. On or about August 31, 2023, a Board appointed physician (Dr. F.H.) performed a face-to-face evaluation of Respondent. During his evaluation, Dr. F.H. noted Respondent had difficulty hearing even with the use of his hearing aids. Respondent required Dr. F.H. to repeat his questions multiple times, and even then, Respondent's understanding of the questions were often in error. Respondent indicated he saw a hearing doctor every six weeks, but was unable to recall the name of this doctor. When asked about his medications, Respondent could only recall his pain medication and blood pressure medication. Respondent indicated he had a bag full of bottles of medications that were nearly empty, but could not recall what these medications were.
- 12. Based upon his evaluation of Respondent, Dr. F.H. concluded Respondent suffered from memory impairment, severe hearing loss, and cognitive impairment, rendering Respondent unable to practice medicine safely.
- 13. On or about September 28, 2023, a Board appointed psychiatrist (Dr. A.S.) performed a face-to-face evaluation of Respondent. During his evaluation, Dr. A.S. administered several tests, including, but not limited to, the Millon Clinical Multiaxial Inventory-III (MCMI-III), a Mental Status Exam (MSE), and a Rey 15-Item Memorization Test (RMT). On the RMT, Respondent could only recall 4 out of the 15 items, indicative of severe cognitive challenges. On the MCMI-III, Respondent required repeated instructions regarding how to answer simple True/False questions and needed Dr. A.S. to write on a board "T" for True, and "F" for False to complete the evaluation. On the MSE, Respondent scored 22 out of 30 indicative of cognitive impairment. Throughout Dr. A.S.'s evaluation, Respondent struggled to hear instructions and questions and required the instructions and questions to be repeated numerous times.
