20	IT IS HEREBY STIPULATED AND AGREED by and between the parties to the above-
21	entitled proceedings that the following matters are true:
22	PARTIES
23	1. Reji Varghese (Complainant) is the Executive Director of the Medical Board of
24	California (Board). He brought this action solely in his official capacity and is represented in this
25	matter by Rob Bonta, Attorney General of the State of California, by Robert W. Lincoln, Deputy
26	Attorney General.
27	2. Nick Salim Nurani, M.D. (Respondent) is represented in this proceeding by David
28	Rosenberg, Esq.
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3. On or about October 13, 1977, the Board issued Physician's and Surgeon's Certificate
 No. A 31655 to Respondent. That license was in full force and effect at all times relevant to the
 charges brought in Accusation No. 800-2023-104377 and will expire on July 31, 2026, unless
 renewed.

## **JURISDICTION**

Accusation No. 800-2023-104377 was filed before the Board, and is currently
pending against Respondent. The Accusation and all other statutorily required documents were
properly served on Respondent on September 12, 2024. Respondent timely filed his Notice of
Defense contesting the Accusation. A copy of Accusation No. 800-2023-104377 is attached as
Exhibit A and incorporated by reference.

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# ADVISEMENT AND WAIVERS

Respondent has carefully read, fully discussed with counsel, and understands the
 charges and allegations in Accusation No. 800-2023-104377. Respondent also has carefully read,
 fully discussed with counsel, and understands the effects of this Stipulated Surrender of License
 and Order.

6. Respondent is fully aware of his legal rights in this matter, including the right to a
hearing on the charges and allegations in the Accusation; the right to confront and cross-examine
the witnesses against him; the right to present evidence and to testify on his own behalf; the right
to the issuance of subpoenas to compel the attendance of witnesses and the production of
documents; the right to reconsideration and court review of an adverse decision; and all other
rights accorded by the California Administrative Procedure Act and other applicable laws.

7. Respondent voluntarily, knowingly, and intelligently waives and gives up each and
every right set forth above.

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#### **CULPABILITY**

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8. Respondent understands that the charges and allegations in Accusation No. 800-2023104377, if proven at a hearing, constitute cause for imposing discipline upon his Physician's and
Surgeon's Certificate.

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Stipulated Surrender of License and Disciplinary Order (Case No. 800-2023-104377)

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1	9. For the purpose of resolving the Accusation without the expense and uncertainty of
2	further proceedings, Respondent agrees that, at a hearing, Complainant could establish a factual
3	basis for the charges in the Accusation and that those charges constitute cause for discipline.
4	Respondent hereby gives up his right to contest that cause for discipline exists based on those
5	charges.
6	10. Respondent understands that by signing this stipulation he enables the Board to issue
7	an order accepting the surrender of his Physician's and Surgeon's Certificate without further
8	process.
9	RESERVATION
10	11. The admissions made by Respondent herein are only for the purposes of this
11	proceeding, or any other proceedings in which the Medical Board of California or other
12	professional licensing agency is involved, and shall not be admissible in any other criminal or
13	civil proceeding.
14	<u>CONTINGENCY</u>
15	12. Business and Professions Code section 2224, subdivision (b), provides, in pertinent
16	part, that the Medical Board "shall delegate to its executive director the authority to adopt a
17	stipulation for surrender of a license."
18	13. Respondent understands that, by signing this stipulation, he enables the Executive
19	Director of the Board to issue an order, on behalf of the Board, accepting the surrender of his
20	Physician's and Surgeon's Certificate No. A 31655 without further notice to, or opportunity to be
21	heard by, Respondent.
22	14. This Stipulated Surrender of License and Disciplinary Order shall be subject to the
23	approval of the Executive Director on behalf of the Board. The parties agree that this Stipulated
24	Surrender of License and Disciplinary Order shall be submitted to the Executive Director for his
25	consideration in the above-entitled matter and, further, that the Executive Director shall have a
26	reasonable period of time in which to consider and act on this Stipulated Surrender of License and
27	Disciplinary Order after receiving it. By signing this stipulation, Respondent fully understands

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and agrees that he may not withdraw his agreement or seek to rescind this stipulation prior to the
 time the Executive Director, on behalf of the Medical Board, considers and acts upon it.

The parties agree that this Stipulated Surrender of License and Disciplinary Order 3 15. 4 shall be null and void and not binding upon the parties unless approved and adopted by the 5 Executive Director on behalf of the Board, except for this paragraph, which shall remain in full force and effect. Respondent fully understands and agrees that in deciding whether or not to 6 7 approve and adopt this Stipulated Surrender of License and Disciplinary Order, the Executive Director and/or the Board may receive oral and written communications from its staff and/or the 8 9 Attorney General's Office. Communications pursuant to this paragraph shall not disqualify the Executive Director, the Board, any member thereof, and/or any other person from future 10 participation in this or any other matter affecting or involving respondent. In the event that the 11 Executive Director on behalf of the Board does not, in his discretion, approve and adopt this 12 Stipulated Surrender of License and Disciplinary Order, with the exception of this paragraph, it 13 shall not become effective, shall be of no evidentiary value whatsoever, and shall not be relied 14 upon or introduced in any disciplinary action by either party hereto. Respondent further agrees 15 16 that should this Stipulated Surrender of License and Disciplinary Order be rejected for any reason by the Executive Director on behalf of the Board, Respondent will assert no claim that the 17 Executive Director, the Board, or any member thereof, was prejudiced by its/his/her review, 18 discussion and/or consideration of this Stipulated Surrender of License and Disciplinary Order or 19 of any matter or matters related hereto. 20

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## ADDITIONAL PROVISIONS

16. This Stipulated Surrender of License and Disciplinary Order is intended by the parties
herein to be an integrated writing representing the complete, final and exclusive embodiment of
the agreements of the parties in the above-entitled matter.

17. The parties agree that copies of this Stipulated Surrender of License and Disciplinary
Order, including copies of the signatures of the parties, may be used in lieu of original documents
and signatures and, further, that such copies shall have the same force and effect as originals.
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1	18. In consideration of the foregoing admissions and stipulations, the parties agree the
2	Executive Director of the Board may, without further notice to or opportunity to be heard by
3	Respondent, issue and enter the following Disciplinary Order on behalf of the Board:
4	ORDER
5	IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that Physician's and Surgeon's Certificate No. A 31655, issued
6	to Respondent Nick Salim Nurani, M.D., is surrendered and accepted by the Board.
7	1. The surrender of Respondent's Physician's and Surgeon's Certificate and the
8	acceptance of the surrendered license by the Board shall constitute the imposition of discipline
9	against Respondent. This stipulation constitutes a record of the discipline and shall become a part
10	of Respondent's license history with the Board.
11	2. Respondent shall lose all rights and privileges as a physician and surgeon in
12	California as of the effective date of the Board's Decision and Order.
13	3. Respondent shall cause to be delivered to the Board his pocket license and, if one was
14	issued, his wall certificate on or before the effective date of the Decision and Order.
15	4. If Respondent ever files an application for licensure or a petition for reinstatement in
16	the State of California, the Board shall treat it as a petition for reinstatement. Respondent must
17	comply with all the laws, regulations and procedures for reinstatement of a revoked or
18	surrendered license in effect at the time the petition is filed, and all of the charges and allegations
19	contained in Accusation No. 800-2023-104377 shall be deemed to be true, correct and admitted
20	by Respondent when the Board determines whether to grant or deny the petition.
21	5. Respondent shall pay the agency its costs of investigation and enforcement in the
22	amount of \$45,001.50 prior to issuance of a new or reinstated license.
23	6. If Respondent should ever apply or reapply for a new license or certification, or
24	petition for reinstatement of a license, by any other health care licensing agency in the State of
25	California, all of the charges and allegations contained in Accusation No. 800-2023-104377 shall
26	be deemed to be true, correct, and admitted by Respondent for the purpose of any Statement of
27	Issues or any other proceeding seeking to deny or restrict licensure.

1	3. On or about August 21, 2024, an Interim Order of Suspension was issued by the
2	Office of Administrative Hearings, immediately suspending Physician's and Surgeon's Certificate
3	No. A 31655, and prohibiting Respondent from practicing medicine in the State of California. As
4	a result, Respondent remains suspended from the practice of medicine pending the issuance of a
5	final decision after an administrative hearing on the Accusation.
6	JURISDICTION
7	4. This Accusation is brought before the Board, under the authority of the following
-8	laws. All section references are to the Business and Professions Code (Code) unless otherwise
9	indicated.
10	5. Section 2227 of the Code states:
11	(a) A licensee whose matter has been heard by an administrative law judge of
12	the Medical Quality Hearing Panel as designated in Section 11371 of the Government Code, or whose default has been entered, and who is found guilty, or who has entered
13	into a stipulation for disciplinary action with the board, may, in accordance with the provisions of this chapter:
14	(1) Have his or her license revoked upon order of the board.
15	(2) Have his or her right to practice suspended for a period not to exceed one year upon order of the board.
16 17	(3) Be placed on probation and be required to pay the costs of probation monitoring upon order of the board.
18. 19	(4) Be publicly reprimanded by the board. The public reprimand may include a requirement that the licensee complete relevant educational courses approved by the board.
20	(5) Have any other action taken in relation to discipline as part of an order of probation, as the board or an administrative law judge may deem proper.
21   22	(b) Any matter heard pursuant to subdivision (a), except for warning letters, medical review or advisory conferences, professional competency examinations,
22	continuing education activities, and cost reimbursement associated therewith that are agreed to with the board and successfully completed by the licensee, or other matters

7		(Mental Illness and/or Physical Illness Affecting Competency)
8	8.	Respondent's Physician and Surgeon's Certificate No. A 31655 is subject to action
9	under sect	ion 822 of the Code, in that his ability to practice medicine safely is impaired because
0	he is ment	ally ill and/or physically ill, affecting competency, as more particularly alleged
1	hereinafter	
2	9.	On or about December 8, 2023, the Board's Central Complaint Unit (CCU) received
3	a complair	nt alleging Respondent was abusing alcohol and controlled substances.
4	10.	On or about March 31, 2024, Respondent voluntarily submitted to a mental
5	examinatio	on from Board-appointed physician D.B., M.D. (Dr. D.B.).

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1	11. After examination and review of records, Dr. D.B. concluded, among other things,	
2	that Respondent is not able to practice medicine safely without restriction or conditions at this	
3	time due to his "[c]redibility and evidence of benzodiazepine use disorder," which requires	
4	monitoring. Dr. D.B., further opined that because Respondent shows evidence of substance abus	
5	disorder, but the severity is unknown, he requires monitoring and oversight to practice safely.	
6	PRAYER	
7	WHEREFORE, Complainant requests that a hearing be held on the matters herein alleged,	
8	and that following the hearing, the Medical Board of California issue a decision:	
9	1. Taking action as authorized by section 822 of the Code as the Medical Board, in its	
10	discretion, deems necessary and proper;	
11	2. Revoking or suspending Physician's and Surgeon's Certificate Number A 31655,	
12	issued to Respondent Nick Salim Nurani, M.D.;	
13	3. Revoking, suspending or denying approval of Respondent Nick Salim Nurani, M.D.'s	
14	authority to supervise physician assistants and advanced practice nurses;	
15	4. Ordering Respondent Nick Salim Nurani, M.D., to pay the Board the costs of the	
16	investigation and enforcement of this case, and if placed on probation, the costs of probation	
17	monitoring; and	
18	5. Taking such other and further action as deemed necessary and proper.
