14	IT IS HEREBY STIPULATED AND AGREED by and between the parties to the above-	
15	entitled proceedings, that the following matters are true:	
16	1. Complainant, Reji Varghese, is	the Executive Director of the Medical Board of
17	California, Department of Consumer Affairs ("Board").	
18	2. Dagoberto Jesus Rodriguez, M.I	O. ("Respondent") has carefully read and fully
19	understands the effect of this Stipulation.	
20 21	3. Respondent agrees that based or	the action taken by the Oregon Medical Board,
22	(Exhibit A) cause exists to discipline his California Physician's and Surgeon's certificate	
23	pursuant to Business and Professions Code sections 141(a) and 2305.	
24	4. Respondent understands that, if	proven at hearing, the charges and allegations
25	under investigation would constitute cause for imposing discipline upon Respondent's license	
26	issued by the Board.	

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- 5. Respondent is aware of each of his rights, including the right to a hearing, the right to confront and cross-examine witnesses who would testify against Respondent, the right to testify and present evidence on his own behalf, as well as to the issuance of subpoenas to compel the attendance of witnesses and the production of documents, the right to contest any charges and allegations, and other rights which are accorded Respondent pursuant to the California Administrative Procedure Act (Gov. Code, §11500 et seq.) and other applicable laws, including the right to seek reconsideration, review by the superior court, and appellate review.
- 6. In order to avoid the expense and uncertainty of a hearing, Respondent freely and voluntarily waives each and every one of these rights set forth above. Respondent hereby agrees to surrender Physician's and Surgeon's Certificate No. C 161735.
- 7. Respondent understands that by signing this Stipulation he is enabling the Board to accept the surrender of his license without further process, as provided by section 11415.60(b) of the Government Code.
- 8. Upon acceptance of the Stipulation by the Board, Respondent understands that he will no longer be permitted to practice as a Physician and Surgeon in California, and also agrees to surrender and cause to be delivered to the Board both his license and wallet certificate before the effective date of the Decision.
- 9. Respondent hereby represents that he does not intend to seek relicensure or reinstatement as a Physician and Surgeon. Respondent fully understands and agrees, however, that if Respondent ever files an application for relicensure or reinstatement in the State of California, the Board shall treat it as a Petition for Reinstatement, and Respondent must comply with all the laws, regulations and procedures for reinstatement of a revoked license in effect at the time the Petition is filed. Case Report No. 800-2021-082478, including all referenced attachments and other exhibits, and any additional attachments, and other exhibits, that may be generated subsequent to the filing of the surrender of license, shall be admissible as direct evidence, and any time based defenses, such as laches or any applicable statute of limitations, shall be waived when the Board determines whether to grant or deny the Petition.

9	The Oregon Medical Board (Board) is the state agency responsible for licensing,		
10	regulating and disciplining certain health care providers, including physicians, in the State of		
11	Oregon. Dagoberto Jesus Rodriguez, MD (Applicant) has applied for an unlimited license to		
12	practice medicine in Oregon.		
13	2.		
14	On July 10, 2019, the Board opened an investigation after receiving credible information		
15	regarding Applicant's possible violation of the Medical Practice Act due to his prescribing to		
16	patients in Oregon without an Oregon medical license.		
17	3.		
18	On October 28, 2020, the Board issued a Notice of Intent to Deny License Application in		
19	which the Board proposed to deny Applicant's application for a license to practice medicine in		
20	the State of Oregon and imposing up to the maximum range of potential sanctions identified in		
21	Oregon Revised Statutes (ORS) 677.205(2), which may include denying the application for		
22	licensure, imposing a \$10,000 civil penalty per violation, and assessment of costs, based upon		
23	violations of the Medical Practice Act.

25	Applicant and the Board desire to settle this matter by the entry of this Stipulated Order.		
26	Applicant understands that he has the right to a contested case hearing under the Administrative		
27	Procedures Act (Oregon Revised Statutes chapter 183), and fully and finally waives the right to		

contested case hearing and any appeal therefrom by the signing of and entry of this Order in the 1 2 Board's records. Applicant neither admits nor denies, but the Board finds that Applicant engaged in conduct that violated the Medical Practice Act, to wit: ORS 677.080(4) the practice 3 of medicine in Oregon without a license; ORS 677.190(1)(a) unprofessional or dishonorable 4 5 conduct, as defined in ORS 677.188(4)(a) any conduct contrary to recognized standards of ethics 6 of the medical profession; and ORS 677.190(23) violation of the federal Controlled Substances 7 Act, to wit: 21 CFR, \$1306.03. Applicant understands that this Order is a public record and is a disciplinary action that is reportable to the National Practitioner Data Bank and the Federation of 8 9 State Medical Boards. Applicant understands the terms of this Order and signs freely, without 10 fraud or duress. 11 5. 12 Applicant and the Board agree that the Board will close this investigation and resolve this 13 matter by entry of this Stipulated Order, subject to the following conditions: 14 5.1 Applicant withdraws his application for an Oregon medical license while under 15 investigation. 16 5.2 Applicant agrees to never re-apply for a medical license in the State of Oregon. 17 Applicant must obey all federal and Oregon state laws and regulations pertaining 5.3 18 to the practice of medicine.
