20 IT IS HEREBY STIPULATED AND AGREED by and between the parties to the above-
21 entitled proceedings that the following matters are true:

22 **PARTIES**

23 1. Reji Varghese (Complainant) is the Executive Director of the Medical Board of
24 California (Board). He brought this action solely in his official capacity and is represented in this
25 matter by Rob Bonta, Attorney General of the State of California, by Keith C. Shaw, Deputy
26 Attorney General.

27 2. Clara Lucy Polak, M.D. (Respondent) is represented in this proceeding by attorney
28 Raymond J. McMahon, Esq., whose address is: 5440 Trabuco Road, Irvine, CA 92620.

3. On or about October 2, 1998, the Board issued Physician's and Surgeon's Certificate No. A 66649 to Respondent Clara Lucy Polak, M.D. That license was in full force and effect at all times relevant to the charges brought in Accusation No. 800-2024-109403 and will expire on June 30, 2026, unless renewed.

JURISDICTION

4. Accusation No. 800-2024-109403 was filed before the Board and is currently pending against Respondent. The Accusation and all other statutorily required documents were properly served on Respondent on November 4, 2024. Respondent timely filed her Notice of Defense contesting the Accusation. A copy of Accusation No. 800-2024-109403 is attached as Exhibit A and incorporated by reference.

ADVISEMENT AND WAIVERS

5. Respondent has carefully read, fully discussed with counsel, and understands the charges and allegations in Accusation No. 800-2024-109403. Respondent also has carefully read, fully discussed with counsel, and understands the effects of this Stipulated Surrender of License and Order.

6. Respondent is fully aware of her legal rights in this matter, including the right to a hearing on the charges and allegations in the Accusation; the right to confront and cross-examine the witnesses against her; the right to present evidence and to testify on her own behalf; the right to the issuance of subpoenas to compel the attendance of witnesses and the production of documents; the right to reconsideration and court review of an adverse decision; and all other rights accorded by the California Administrative Procedure Act and other applicable laws.

7. Having the benefit of counsel, Respondent voluntarily, knowingly, and intelligently waives and gives up each and every right set forth above.

CULPABILITY

8. Respondent understands that the charges and allegations in Accusation No. 800-2024-109403, if proven at a hearing, constitute cause for imposing action upon her Physician's and Surgeon's Certificate.

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9. For the purpose of resolving the Accusation without the expense and uncertainty of further proceedings, Respondent gives up her right to contest that, at a hearing, Complainant could establish a *prima facie* case with respect to the charges and allegations contained in the Accusation.

10. Respondent agrees that if an accusation is ever filed against her before the Medical Board of California, all of the charges and allegations contained in Accusation No. 800-2024-109403 shall be deemed true, correct, and fully admitted by Respondent for purposes of that proceeding or any other licensing proceeding involving Respondent in the State of California.

11. Respondent understands that by signing this stipulation she enables the Board to issue an order accepting the surrender of her Physician's and Surgeon's Certificate without further process.

CONTINGENCY

12. Business and Professions Code section 2224, subdivision (b), provides, in pertinent part, that the Medical Board “shall delegate to its executive director the authority to adopt a ... stipulation for surrender of a license.”

13. Respondent understands that, by signing this stipulation, she enables the Executive Director of the Board to issue an order, on behalf of the Board, accepting the surrender of her Physician's and Surgeon's Certificate No. A 66649 without further notice to, or opportunity to be heard by, Respondent.

14. This Stipulated Surrender of License and Order shall be subject to the approval of the Executive Director on behalf of the Board. The parties agree that this Stipulated Surrender of License and Order shall be submitted to the Executive Director for his consideration in the above-entitled matter and, further, that the Executive Director shall have a reasonable period of time in which to consider and act on this Stipulated Surrender of License and Order after receiving it. By signing this stipulation, Respondent fully understands and agrees that she may not withdraw her agreement or seek to rescind this stipulation prior to the time the Executive Director, on behalf of the Medical Board, considers and acts upon it.

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15. The parties agree that this Stipulated Surrender of License and Order shall be null and void and not binding upon the parties unless approved and adopted by the Executive Director on behalf of the Board, except for this paragraph, which shall remain in full force and effect. Respondent fully understands and agrees that in deciding whether or not to approve and adopt this Stipulated Surrender of License and Order, the Executive Director and/or the Board may receive oral and written communications from its staff and/or the Attorney General's Office. Communications pursuant to this paragraph shall not disqualify the Executive Director, the Board, any member thereof, and/or any other person from future participation in this or any other matter affecting or involving respondent. In the event that the Executive Director on behalf of the Board does not, in his discretion, approve and adopt this Stipulated Surrender of License and Order, with the exception of this paragraph, it shall not become effective, shall be of no evidentiary value whatsoever, and shall not be relied upon or introduced in any disciplinary action by either party hereto. Respondent further agrees that should this Stipulated Surrender of License and Order be rejected for any reason by the Executive Director on behalf of the Board, Respondent will assert no claim that the Executive Director, the Board, or any member thereof, was prejudiced by its/his/her review, discussion and/or consideration of this Stipulated Surrender of License and Order or of any matter or matters related hereto.

ADDITIONAL PROVISIONS

16. This Stipulated Surrender of License and Order is intended by the parties herein to be an integrated writing representing the complete, final and exclusive embodiment of the agreements of the parties in the above-entitled matter.

17. The parties agree that copies of this Stipulated Surrender of License and Order, including copies of the signatures of the parties, may be used in lieu of original documents and signatures and, further, that such copies shall have the same force and effect as originals.

18. In consideration of the foregoing admissions and stipulations, the parties agree the Executive Director of the Board may, without further notice to or opportunity to be heard by Respondent, issue and enter the following Order on behalf of the Board:

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ORDER

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that Physician's and Surgeon's Certificate No. A 66649, issued to Respondent Clara Lucy Polak, M.D., is surrendered and accepted by the Board.

1. The surrender of Respondent's Physician's and Surgeon's Certificate and the acceptance of the surrendered license by the Board shall constitute the imposition of action against Respondent. This stipulation constitutes a record of the action and shall become a part of Respondent's license history with the Board.

2. Respondent shall lose all rights and privileges as a Physician and Surgeon in California as of the effective date of the Board's Decision and Order.

3. Respondent shall cause to be delivered to the Board her pocket license and, if one was issued, her wall certificate on or before the effective date of the Decision and Order.

4. If Respondent ever files an application for licensure or a petition for reinstatement in the State of California, the Board shall treat it as a petition for reinstatement. Respondent must comply with all the laws, regulations and procedures for reinstatement of a revoked or surrendered license in effect at the time the petition is filed, and all of the charges and allegations contained in Accusation No. 800-2024-109403 shall be deemed to be true, correct and admitted by Respondent when the Board determines whether to grant or deny the petition.

5. Respondent shall pay the agency its costs of investigation and enforcement in the amount of \$8,820.00 prior to issuance of a new or reinstated license.

6. If Respondent should ever apply or reapply for a new license or certification, or petition for reinstatement of a license, by any other health care licensing agency in the State of California, all of the charges and allegations contained in Accusation No. 800-2024-109403 shall be deemed to be true, correct, and admitted by Respondent for the purpose of any Statement of Issues or any other proceeding seeking to deny or restrict licensure.

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1 ACCEPTANCE

2 I have carefully read the above Stipulated Settlement and Order and have fully discussed it
3 with my attorney, Raymond J. McMahon, Esq. I understand the stipulation and the effect it will
4 have on my Physician's and Surgeon's Certificate. I enter into this Stipulated Settlement and
5 Order voluntarily, knowingly, and intelligently, and agree to be bound by the Decision and Order
6 of the Medical Board of California.

21 **PARTIES**

22 1. Reji Varghese (Complainant) brings this Accusation solely in his official capacity as
23 the Executive Director of the Medical Board of California, Department of Consumer Affairs
24 (Board).

25 2. On or about October 2, 1998, the Medical Board issued Physician's and Surgeon's
26 Certificate No. A 66649 to Clara Lucy Polak, M.D. (Respondent). The Physician's and
27 Surgeon's Certificate was in full force and effect at all times relevant to the charges brought
28 herein and will expire on June 30, 2026, unless renewed.

1 JURISDICTION

2 3. This Accusation is brought before the Board, under the authority of the following
3 laws. All section references are to the Business and Professions Code (Code) unless otherwise
4 indicated.

5 4. Section 2227 of the Code provides that a licensee who is found guilty under the
6 Medical Practice Act may have his or her license revoked, suspended for a period not to exceed
7 one year, placed on probation and required to pay the costs of probation monitoring, or such other
8 action taken in relation to discipline as the Board deems proper.

9 5. Section 822 of the Code provides that if the Board determines that a licensee's ability
10 to practice his or her profession safely is impaired because the licensee is mentally ill, or
11 physically ill affecting competency, the Board may take action by revoking or suspending the
12 license, placing the licensee on probation, or taking such other action as the Board in its
13 discretion deems proper.

14 COST RECOVERY

15 6. Section 125.3 of the Code provides, in pertinent part, that the Board may request the
16 administrative law judge to direct a licensee found to have committed a violation or violations of
17 the licensing act to pay a sum not to exceed the reasonable costs of the investigation and
18 enforcement of the case, with failure of the licensee to comply subjecting the license to not being
19 renewed or reinstated. If a case settles, recovery of investigation and enforcement costs may be
20 included in a stipulated settlement.

21 CAUSE FOR ACTION

22 (Mental or Physical Impairment)

23 7. Respondent is subject to action pursuant to Section 822 of the Code in that her ability
24 to practice medicine safely is impaired because she is mentally ill and/or physically ill affecting
25 competency. The circumstances are as follows:

26 8. On or about July 12, 2024, Respondent agreed to voluntarily undergo a psychiatric
27 evaluation after exhibiting signs of memory impairment, which was completed by a Board-
28 appointed psychiatrist. During the psychiatric interview, the evaluator noted that Respondent was

1 intelligent, and her mood, affect, and attitude were appropriately responsive; however, confusion and
2 memory impairment were obvious. While Respondent was able to acknowledge that she had memory
3 problems, she lacked insight into the depths of her impairment.

4 9. After the evaluator's review of records and mental status examination that included
5 psychometric testing, it was concluded that Respondent suffers from a cognitive disorder that
6 affects her ability to practice medicine safely. The evaluator determined that Respondent's
7 continued practice of medicine will endanger the public health, safety, and welfare. Even with
8 monitoring, it was noted that Respondent would not be able to practice medicine safely, and her
9 cognitive limitations will worsen over time.

10 PRAYER

11 WHEREFORE, Complainant requests that a hearing be held on the matters herein alleged,
12 and that following the hearing, the Medical Board of California issue a decision:

13 1. Taking action as authorized by section 822 of the Code as the Medical Board, in its
14 discretion, deems necessary and proper;

15 2. Revoking or suspending Physician's and Surgeon's Certificate No. A 66649, issued
16 to Respondent Clara Lucy Polak, M.D.;

17 3. Revoking, suspending or denying approval of Respondent Clara Lucy Polak, M.D.'s
18 authority to supervise physician assistants and advanced practice nurses;

19 4. Ordering Respondent Clara Lucy Polak, M.D., to pay the Board the costs of the
20 investigation and enforcement of this case, and if placed on probation, the costs of probation
21 monitoring; and

22 5. Taking such other and further action as deemed necessary and proper.
