**STIPULATED SURRENDER OF
LICENSE AND ORDER**

18 **IT IS HEREBY STIPULATED AND AGREED by and between the parties to the**
19 **above-entitled proceedings that the following matters are true:**

20
21 **PARTIES**

22 1. Reji Varghese (Complainant) is the Executive Director of the Medical Board of
23 California (Board). He brought this action solely in his official capacity and is represented in this
24 matter by Rob Bonta, Attorney General of the State of California, by Caitlin Ross, Deputy
25 Attorney General.

26 2. CECIL ARTHUR BRADLEY, M.D. (Respondent) is represented in this proceeding
27 by attorney Shannon V. Baker, whose address is: Rothschild, Wishek + Sands, 765 University
28 Avenue, Sacramento, CA 95825.

3. On or about April 11, 1972, the Board issued Physician's & Surgeon's Certificate No. C 34133 to Respondent. That license was in full force and effect at all times relevant to the charges brought in Accusation No. 800-2025-114988 and will expire on October 31, 2025, unless renewed.

JURISDICTION

4. Accusation No. 800-2025-114988 was filed before the Board and is currently pending against Respondent. The Accusation and all other statutorily required documents were properly served on Respondent on September 4, 2025. Respondent filed his Notice of Defense contesting the Accusation. A copy of Accusation No. 800-2025-114988 is attached as Exhibit A and incorporated by reference.

ADVISEMENT AND WAIVERS

5. Respondent has carefully read, fully discussed with counsel, and understands the charges and allegations in Accusation No. 800-2025-114988. Respondent also has carefully read, fully discussed with counsel, and understands the effects of this Stipulated Surrender of License and Order.

6. Respondent is fully aware of his legal rights in this matter, including the right to a hearing on the charges and allegations in the Accusation; the right to confront and cross-examine the witnesses against him; the right to present evidence and to testify on his own behalf; the right to the issuance of subpoenas to compel the attendance of witnesses and the production of documents; the right to reconsideration and court review of an adverse decision; and all other rights accorded by the California Administrative Procedure Act and other applicable laws.

7. Respondent voluntarily, knowingly, and intelligently waives and gives up each and every right set forth above.

CULPABILITY

8. Respondent understands that the charges and allegations in Accusation No. 800-2025-114988, if proven at a hearing, constitute cause for imposing discipline upon his Physician's & Surgeon's Certificate.

9. For the purpose of resolving the Accusation without the expense and uncertainty of further proceedings, Respondent agrees that, at a hearing, Complainant could establish a factual basis for the charges in the Accusation and that those charges constitute cause for discipline. Respondent hereby gives up his right to contest that cause for discipline exists based on those charges.

10. Respondent understands that by signing this stipulation he enables the Board to issue an order accepting the surrender of his Physician's & Surgeon's Certificate without further process.

RESERVATION

11. The admissions made by Respondent herein are only for the purposes of this proceeding, or any other proceedings in which the Medical Board of California or other professional licensing agency is involved, and shall not be admissible in any other criminal or civil proceeding.

CONTINGENCY

12. Business and Professions Code section 2224, subdivision (b), provides, in pertinent part, that the Medical Board “shall delegate to its executive director the authority to adopt a ... stipulation for surrender of a license[.]”

13. Respondent understands that, by signing this stipulation, he enables the Executive Director of the Board to issue an order, on behalf of the Board, accepting the surrender of his Physician's & Surgeon's Certificate No. C 34133 without further notice to, or opportunity to be heard by, Respondent.

14. This Stipulated Surrender of License and Disciplinary Order shall be subject to the approval of the Executive Director on behalf of the Board. The parties agree that this Stipulated Surrender of License and Disciplinary Order shall be submitted to the Executive Director for his consideration in the above-entitled matter and, further, that the Executive Director shall have a reasonable period of time in which to consider and act on this Stipulated Surrender of License and Disciplinary Order after receiving it. By signing this stipulation, Respondent fully understands

1 and agrees that he may not withdraw his agreement or seek to rescind this stipulation prior to the
2 time the Executive Director, on behalf of the Medical Board, considers and acts upon it.

3 15. The parties agree that this Stipulated Surrender of License and Disciplinary Order
4 shall be null and void and not binding upon the parties unless approved and adopted by the
5 Executive Director on behalf of the Board, except for this paragraph, which shall remain in full
6 force and effect. Respondent fully understands and agrees that in deciding whether or not to
7 approve and adopt this Stipulated Surrender of License and Disciplinary Order, the Executive
8 Director and/or the Board may receive oral and written communications from its staff and/or the
9 Attorney General's Office. Communications pursuant to this paragraph shall not disqualify the
10 Executive Director, the Board, any member thereof, and/or any other person from future
11 participation in this or any other matter affecting or involving respondent. In the event that the
12 Executive Director on behalf of the Board does not, in his discretion, approve and adopt this
13 Stipulated Surrender of License and Disciplinary Order, with the exception of this paragraph, it
14 shall not become effective, shall be of no evidentiary value whatsoever, and shall not be relied
15 upon or introduced in any disciplinary action by either party hereto. Respondent further agrees
16 that should this Stipulated Surrender of License and Disciplinary Order be rejected for any reason
17 by the Executive Director on behalf of the Board, Respondent will assert no claim that the
18 Executive Director, the Board, or any member thereof, was prejudiced by its/his/her review,
19 discussion and/or consideration of this Stipulated Surrender of License and Disciplinary Order or
20 of any matter or matters related hereto.

21 **ADDITIONAL PROVISIONS**

22 16. This Stipulated Surrender of License and Disciplinary Order is intended by the parties
23 herein to be an integrated writing representing the complete, final and exclusive embodiment of
24 the agreements of the parties in the above-entitled matter.

25 17. The parties agree that copies of this Stipulated Surrender of License and Disciplinary
26 Order, including copies of the signatures of the parties, may be used in lieu of original documents
27 and signatures and, further, that such copies shall have the same force and effect as originals.
28

18. In consideration of the foregoing admissions and stipulations, the parties agree the Executive Director of the Board may, without further notice to or opportunity to be heard by Respondent, issue and enter the following Disciplinary Order on behalf of the Board:

ORDER

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that Physician's & Surgeon's Certificate No. C 34133, issued to Respondent CECIL ARTHUR BRADLEY, M.D., is surrendered and accepted by the Board.

1. The surrender of Respondent's Physician's & Surgeon's Certificate and the acceptance of the surrendered license by the Board shall constitute the imposition of discipline against Respondent. This stipulation constitutes a record of the discipline and shall become a part of Respondent's license history with the Board.

2. Respondent shall lose all rights and privileges as a physician and surgeon in California as of the effective date of the Board's Decision and Order.

3. Respondent shall cause to be delivered to the Board his pocket license and, if one was issued, his wall certificate on or before the effective date of the Decision and Order.

4. If Respondent ever files an application for licensure or a petition for reinstatement in the State of California, the Board shall treat it as a petition for reinstatement. Respondent must comply with all the laws, regulations and procedures for reinstatement of a revoked or surrendered license in effect at the time the petition is filed, and all of the charges and allegations contained in Accusation No. 800-2025-114988 shall be deemed to be true, correct and admitted by Respondent when the Board determines whether to grant or deny the petition.

ACCEPTANCE

I have carefully read the above Stipulated Surrender of License and Order and have fully discussed it with my attorney Shannon V. Baker. I understand the stipulation and the effect it will have on my Physician's & Surgeon's Certificate. I enter into this Stipulated Surrender of License and Order voluntarily, knowingly, and intelligently, and agree to be bound by the Decision and

18 **PARTIES**

19 1. Reji Varghese (Complainant) brings this Accusation solely in his official capacity as
20 the Executive Director of the Medical Board of California, Department of Consumer Affairs
21 (Board).

22 2. On or about April 11, 1972, the Medical Board issued Physician's & Surgeon's
23 Certificate Number C 34133 to Cecil Arthur Bradley, M.D. (Respondent). The Physician's &
24 Surgeon's Certificate was in full force and effect at all times relevant to the charges brought
25 herein and will expire on October 31, 2025, unless renewed.

JURISDICTION

3. This Accusation is brought before the Board, under the authority of the following laws. All section references are to the Business and Professions Code (Code) unless otherwise indicated.

4. Section 2220 of the Code provides that:

Except as otherwise provided by law, the board may take action against all persons guilty of violating this chapter. The board shall enforce and administer this article as to physician and surgeon certificate holders, including those who hold certificates that do not permit them to practice medicine, such as, but not limited to, retired, inactive, or disabled status certificate holders, and the board shall have all the powers granted in this chapter for these purposes including, but not limited to:

(a) Investigating complaints from the public, from other licensees, from health care facilities, or from the board that a physician and surgeon may be guilty of unprofessional conduct. The board shall investigate the circumstances underlying a report received pursuant to Section 805 or 805.01 within 30 days to determine if an interim suspension order or temporary restraining order should be issued. The board shall otherwise provide timely disposition of the reports received pursuant to Section 805 and Section 805.01.

(b) Investigating the circumstances of practice of any physician and surgeon where there have been any judgments, settlements, or arbitration awards requiring the physician and surgeon or his or her professional liability insurer to pay an amount in damages in excess of a cumulative total of thirty thousand dollars (\$30,000) with respect to any claim that injury or damage was proximately caused by the physician's and surgeon's error, negligence, or omission.

(c) Investigating the nature and causes of injuries from cases which shall be reported of a high number of judgments, settlements, or arbitration awards against a physician and surgeon.

5. Section 2227 of the Code provides that:

(a) A licensee whose matter has been heard by an administrative law judge of the Medical Quality Hearing Panel as designated in Section 11371 of the Government Code, or whose default

1 has been entered, and who is found guilty, or who has entered into a stipulation for disciplinary
2 action with the board, may, in accordance with the provisions of this chapter:

3 (1) Have his or her license revoked upon order of the board.

4 (2) Have his or her right to practice suspended for a period not to exceed one year upon
5 order of the board.

6 (3) Be placed on probation and be required to pay the costs of probation monitoring upon
7 order of the board.

8 (4) Be publicly reprimanded by the board. The public reprimand may include a requirement
9 that the licensee complete relevant educational courses approved by the board.

10 (5) Have any other action taken in relation to discipline as part of an order of probation, as
11 the board or an administrative law judge may deem proper.

12 (b) Any matter heard pursuant to subdivision (a), except for warning letters, medical review
13 or advisory conferences, professional competency examinations, continuing education activities,
14 and cost reimbursement associated therewith that are agreed to with the board and successfully
15 completed by the licensee, or other matters made confidential or privileged by existing law, is
16 deemed public, and shall be made available to the public by the board pursuant to Section 803.1.

17 6. Section 822 of the Code provides that:

18 If a licensing agency determines that its licentiate's ability to practice his or her profession
19 safely is impaired because the licentiate is mentally ill, or physically ill affecting competency, the
20 licensing agency may take action by any one of the following methods:

21 (a) Revoking the licentiate's certificate or license.

22 (b) Suspending the licentiate's right to practice.

23 (c) Placing the licentiate on probation.

24 (d) Taking such other action in relation to the licentiate as the licensing agency in its
25 discretion deems proper.

26 The licensing agency shall not reinstate a revoked or suspended certificate or license until it
27 has received competent evidence of the absence or control of the condition which caused its
28

1 action and until it is satisfied that with due regard for the public health and safety the person's
2 right to practice his or her profession may be safely reinstated.

3 **FACTUAL ALLEGATIONS**

4 7. The ability of Respondent Cecil Arthur Bradley, M.D., to practice medicine safely is
5 impaired because his competency to practice medicine has been affected by either a mental
6 condition or a physical condition or both a mental and physical condition.

7 **CAUSE FOR ACTION**

8 **(Business and Profession Code section 822 -- Impairment)**

9 8. Paragraph 7 is incorporated by reference as if set forth herein.

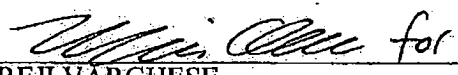
10 9. Respondent Cecil Arthur Bradley, M.D. is subject to action under Code section 822
11 in that his ability to practice medicine safely is impaired because his competency to practice
12 medicine has been affected by either a mental condition or a physical condition or both a mental
13 and physical condition.

14 **PRAYER**

15 WHEREFORE, Complainant requests that a hearing be held on the matters herein alleged,
16 and that following the hearing, the Medical Board of California issue a decision:

- 17 1. Revoking or suspending Physician's & Surgeon's Certificate Number C 34133,
18 issued to Respondent Cecil Arthur Bradley, M.D.;
- 19 2. Revoking, suspending or denying approval of Respondent Cecil Arthur Bradley,
20 M.D.'s authority to supervise physician assistants and advanced practice nurses; and
- 21 3. Taking such other and further action as deemed necessary and proper.
