Stipulated Surrender of License (Case No. 06-2007-187522)

3. On or about December 21, 1994, the Medical Board of California issued Physician's and Surgeon's Certificate No. A 53795 to CRAIG ALAN BITTNER, M.D. (Respondent). Physician's and Surgeon's Certificate No A 53795 was in full force and effect at all times relevant to the charges brought in Accusation No. 06-2007-187556 and will expire on May 31, 2012, unless renewed.

JURISDICTION

4. Accusation No. 06-2007-187556 was filed before the Medical Board of California (Board), Department of Consumer Affairs, State of California, and is currently pending against Respondent. True and correct copies of the Accusation and all other statutorily required documents were properly served on Respondent on May 13, 2011. Respondent timely filed his Notice of Defense contesting the Accusation. A true and correct copy of Accusation No. 06-2007-187556 is attached as Exhibit A and incorporated by reference.

ADVISEMENT AND WAIVERS

- 5. Respondent has carefully read, fully discussed with counsel, and understands the charges and allegations in Accusation No. 06-2007-187556. Respondent also has carefully read, fully discussed with counsel, and understands the effects of this Stipulated Surrender of License and Order.
- 6. Respondent is fully aware of his legal rights in this matter, including the right to a hearing on the charges and allegations in the Accusation; the right to confront and cross-examine the witnesses against him; the right to present evidence and to testify on his own behalf; the right to the issuance of subpoenas to compel the attendance of witnesses and the production of documents; the right to reconsideration and court review of an adverse decision; and all other rights accorded by the California Administrative Procedure Act and other applicable laws.
- 7. Respondent voluntarily, knowingly, and intelligently waives and gives up each and every right set forth above.

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CULPABILITY

- 8. Respondent admits that he aided and abetted the unlicensed practice of medicine in violation of Business and Professions Code section 2264 as alleged in the Third Cause for Discipline in Accusation No. 06-2007-187556, agrees that cause exists for discipline and hereby surrenders his Physician's and Surgeon's Certificate No. A 53795 for the Board's formal acceptance.
- 9. Respondent understands that by signing this stipulation he enables the Board to issue an order accepting the surrender of his Physician's and Surgeon's Certificate No. A 53795 without further process.

CONTINGENCY

- 10. This stipulation shall be subject to approval by the Executive Director on behalf of the Board. Respondent understands and agrees that counsel for Complainant and the staff of the Board may communicate directly with the Executive Director regarding this stipulation and surrender, without notice to or participation by Respondent or his counsel. By signing the stipulation, Respondent understands and agrees that he may not withdraw his agreement or seek to rescind the stipulation prior to the time the Executive Director and acts upon it. If the Executive Director fails to adopt this stipulation as the Board's Decision and Order, the Stipulated Surrender of License and Order shall be of no force or effect, except for this paragraph, it shall be inadmissible in any legal action between the parties, and neither the Executive Director or the Board shall not be disqualified from further action by having considered this matter.
- 11. The parties understand and agree that facsimile copies of this Stipulated Surrender of License and Order, including facsimile signatures thereto, shall have the same force and effect as the originals.
- 12. In consideration of the foregoing admissions and stipulations, the parties agree that the Board may, without further notice or formal proceeding, issue and enter the following Order:

ORDER

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that Physician's and Surgeon's Certificate No. A 53795, issued to Respondent CRAIG ALAN BITTNER, M.D., is surrendered and accepted by the Board.

- 13. The surrender of Respondent's Physician's and Surgeon's Certificate No. A 53795 and the acceptance of the surrendered license by the Board shall constitute the imposition of discipline against Respondent. This stipulation constitutes a record of the discipline and shall become a part of Respondent's license history with the Board.
- 14. Respondent shall lose all rights and privileges as a Physician and Surgeon in California as of the effective date of the Board's Decision and Order.
- 15. Respondent shall cause to be delivered to the Board his pocket license and, if one was issued, his wall certificate on or before the effective date of the Decision and Order.
- 16. If he ever applies for licensure or petitions for reinstatement in the State of California. the Board shall treat it as a new application for licensure. Respondent must comply with all the laws, regulations and procedures for licensure in effect at the time the application or petition is filed, and all of the charges and allegations contained in Accusation No. 06-2007-187556 shall be deemed to be true, correct and admitted by Respondent when the Board determines whether to grant or deny the application or petition.
- 17. If Respondent should ever apply or reapply for a new license or certification, or petition for reinstatement of a license, by any other health care licensing agency in the State of California, all of the charges and allegations contained in Accusation, No. 06-2007-187556 shall be deemed to be true, correct, and admitted by Respondent for the purpose of any Statement of Issues or any other proceeding seeking to deny or restrict licensure.

ACCEPTANCE

I have carefully read the above Stipulated Surrender of License and Order and have fully discussed it with my attorney, Benjamin Fenton. Esq. I understand the stipulation and the effect it will have on my Physician's and Surgeon's Certificate No. A53795. I enter into this Stipulated Surrender of License and Order voluntarily, knowingly, and intelligenty, and agree to be bound by the Decision and Order of the Board.

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Accusation (Case No. 06-2007-187522)

JURISDICTION

- This Accusation is brought before the Medical Board of California (Board).

 Department of Consumer Affairs, State of California, under the authority of the following laws.

 All section references are to the Business and Professions Code (Code) unless otherwise indicated.
- 4. Section 2227 of the Code provides that a licensee who is found guilty under the Medical Practice Act may have his or her license revoked, suspended for a period not to exceed one year, placed on probation and required to pay the costs of probation monitoring, be publicly reprimanded or have such other action taken in relation to discipline as the Board deems proper.
 - 5. Section 2234 of the Code states:

"The Division of Medical Quality! shall take action against any licensee who is charged with unprofessional conduct. In addition to other provisions of this article, unprofessional conduct includes, but is not limited to, the following:

- "(a) Violating or attempting to violate, directly or indirectly, assisting in or abetting the violation of, or conspiring to violate any provision of this chapter [Chapter 5, the Medical Practice Act].
- "(f) Any action or conduct which would have warranted the denial of a certificate.
- 6. Unprofessional conduct under California Business and Professions Code section 2234 is conduct which breaches the rules or ethical code of the medical profession, or conduct which is unbecoming to a member in good standing of the medical profession, and which demonstrates an

California Business and Professions Code section 2002, as amended and effective January 1, 2008, provides that, unless otherwise expressly provided, the term "board" as used in the State Medical Practice Act (Bus. & Prof. Code, §§ 2000, et seq.) means the "Medical Board of California," and references to the "Division of Medical Quality" and "Division of Licensing" in the Act or any other provision of law shall be deemed to refer to the Board.

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unfitness to practice medicine. (Shea v. Board of Medical Examiners (1978) 81 Cal. App.3d 564. 575.)

Section 2052 of the Code states: 7.

- "(a) Notwithstanding Section 146, any person who practices or attempts to practice, or who advertises or holds himself or herself out as practicing, any system or mode of treating the sick or afflicted in this state, or who diagnoses, treats, operates for, or prescribes for any ailment, blemish, deformity, disease, disfigurement, disorder, injury, or other physical or mental condition of any person, without having at the time of so doing a valid, unrevoked, or unsuspended certificate as provided in this chapter [Chapter 5, the Medical Practice Act], or without being authorized to perform the act pursuant to a certificate obtained in accordance with some other provision of law, is guilty of a public offense, punishable by a fine not exceeding ten thousand dollars (\$10,000), by imprisonment in the state prison, by imprisonment in a county jail not exceeding one year, or by both the fine and either imprisonment.
- "(b) Any person who conspires with or aids or abets another to commit any act described in subdivision (a) is guilty of a public offense, subject to the punishment described in that subdivision.
- "(c) The remedy provided in this section shall not preclude any other remedy provided by law."

Section 2236 of the Code states, in pertinent part:

"(a) The conviction of any offense substantially related to the qualifications, functions, or duties of a physician and surgeon constitutes unprofessional conduct within the meaning of this chapter [Chapter 5, the Medical Practice Act]. The record of conviction shall be conclusive evidence only of the fact that the conviction occurred.

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(d) A plea or verdict of guilty or a conviction after a plea of nolo contendere is deemed to be a conviction within the meaning of this section and Section 2236.1. The record of conviction shall be conclusive evidence of the fact that the conviction occurred."

9. Section 2264 of the Code states:

"The employing, directly or indirectly, the aiding, or the abetting of any unlicensed person or any suspended, revoked, or unlicensed practitioner to engage in the practice of medicine or any other mode of treating the sick or afflicted which requires a license to practice constitutes unprofessional conduct."

10. Section 118 of the Code states, in pertinent part:

"b) The suspension, expiration, or forfeiture by operation of law of a license issued by a board in the department, or its suspension, forfeiture, or cancellation by order of the board or by order of a court of law, or its surrender without the written consent of the board, shall not, during any period in which it may be renewed, restored, reissued, or reinstated, deprive the board of its authority to institute or continue a disciplinary proceeding against the licensee upon any ground provided by law or to enter an order suspending or revoking the license or otherwise taking disciplinary action against the licensee on any such ground."

FIRST CAUSE FOR DISCIPLINE

(Conviction of a Crime Substantially Related to the Qualifications, Functions or Duties of a Physician and Surgeon)

11. Respondent is subject to disciplinary action under sections 2227 and 2234, as defined by section 2236, of the Code, in that he was convicted of a crime substantially related to the qualifications, functions and duties of a physician and surgeon, to wit: practicing medicine without a license by aiding and abetting the practice of medicine by an unlicensed person, in violation of Code section 2052(b), a felony. The circumstances are set forth below.

- 12. On or about February 16. 2010, in the case of *The People of the State of California v. Craig Alan Bittner, et al.*. Los Angeles County Superior Court Case No. BA367874, Respondent was charged in Count 1 of a felony complaint with practicing medicine without a license by aiding and abetting the practice of medicine by an unlicensed person, in violation of Code section 2052(b), a felony.
- 13. On or about April 4, 2011, in the above identified criminal matter, Respondent entered a plea of nolo contendere to Count 1 pursuant to a plea bargain. On or about April 4, 2011, a verdict of guilty was entered. Pursuant to the plea bargain, Respondent was ordered to surrender his medical license to the Board by May 15, 2011. In addition, sentencing was delayed for two years.

SECOND CAUSE FOR DISCIPLINE

(Unlicensed Practice)

14. Respondent is further subject to disciplinary action under sections 2227 and 2234, as defined by section 2052 and 2234 and 2234(f), of the Code, in that practiced medicine without a license in that he conspired with and aided and abetted another to violate Code section 2052, subdivision (a) without a valid certificate or authority. The circumstances are set forth in Paragraphs 11 and 13, above, which are hereby incorporated by reference as if fully set forth herein.

THIRD CAUSE FOR DISCIPLINE

(Aiding and Abetting Unlicensed Practice)

15. Respondent is further subject to disciplinary action under sections 2227 and 2234, as defined by section 2264, of the Code, in that he aided and abetted the practice of medicine by an unlicensed person. The circumstances are set forth in Paragraphs 11 and 14, above, which are hereby incorporated by reference as if fully set forth herein.

FOURTH CAUSE FOR DISCIPLINE

(General Unprofessional Conduct)

16. Respondent is further subject to disciplinary action under sections 2227 and 2234, as defined by section 2234, in that he has engaged in conduct which breaches the rules or ethical
