
DECISION

18 In the interest of a prompt and speedy settlement of this matter, consistent with the public
19 interest and the responsibility of the Medical Board of California of the Department of Consumer
20 Affairs, the parties hereby agree to the following Stipulated Surrender and Disciplinary Order
21 which will be submitted to the Board for approval and adoption as the final disposition of the
22 Accusation.

23 PARTIES

24 1. Kimberly Kirchmeyer (Complainant) is the Executive Director of the Medical Board
25 of California. She brought this action solely in her official capacity and is represented in this
26 matter by Kamala D. Harris, Attorney General of the State of California, by Randall R. Murphy,
27 Deputy Attorney General.

1 action between the parties, and the Board shall not be disqualified from further action by having
2 considered this matter.

3 13. The parties understand and agree that Portable Document Format (PDF) and facsimile
4 copies of this Stipulated Surrender of License and Order, including Portable Document Format
5 (PDF) and facsimile signatures thereto, shall have the same force and effect as the originals.

6 14. In consideration of the foregoing admissions and stipulations, the parties agree that
7 the Board may, without further notice or formal proceeding, issue and enter the following Order:

8 **ORDER**

9 IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that Physician's and Surgeon's Certificate No. C37895, issued
10 to Respondent Alex Abbassi, M.D., is surrendered and accepted by the Medical Board of
11 California.

12 1. Respondent shall lose all rights and privileges as a Physician and Surgeon in
13 California as of the effective date of the Board's Decision and Order.

14 2. Respondent shall cause to be delivered to the Board his pocket license and, if one was
15 issued, his wall certificate on or before the effective date of the Decision and Order.

16 3. If he ever applies for licensure or petitions for reinstatement in the State of California,
17 the Board shall treat it as a new application for licensure. Respondent must comply with all the
18 laws, regulations and procedures for licensure in effect at the time the application or petition is
19 filed, and all of the charges and allegations contained in Accusation No. 800-2014-008651 shall
20 be deemed to be true, correct and admitted by Respondent when the Board determines whether to
21 grant or deny the application or petition.

22 **ACCEPTANCE**

23 I have carefully read the above Stipulated Surrender of License and Order and have fully
24 discussed it with my attorney, Thomas Bradford, Esq.. I understand the stipulation and the effect


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
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1 it will have on my Physician's and Surgeon's Certificate. I enter into this Stipulated Surrender of

ACCUSATION

18 Complainant alleges:

19 **PARTIES**

20 1. Kimberly Kirchmeyer (Complainant) brings this Accusation solely in her official
21 capacity as the Executive Director of the Medical Board of California, Department of Consumer
22 Affairs (Board).

23 2. On or about April 3, 1978, the Medical Board issued Physician's and Surgeon's
24 Certificate Number C37895 to Alex Abbassi, M.D. (Respondent). The Physician's and Surgeon's
25 Certificate was in full force and effect at all times relevant to the charges brought herein and will
26 expire on February 29, 2016, unless renewed.

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JURISDICTION

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2 3. This Accusation is brought before the Board, under the authority of the following
3 laws. All section references are to the Business and Professions Code unless otherwise indicated.

4 4. The Medical Practice Act ("Act") is codified at sections 2000-2521 of the Business
5 and Professions Code.

6 5. Pursuant to Code section 2001.1, the Board's highest priority is public protection.

7 6. Section 2004 of the Code states:

8 "The board shall have the responsibility for the following:

9 "(a) The enforcement of the disciplinary and criminal provisions of the Medical
10 Practice Act.

11 "(b) The administration and hearing of disciplinary actions.

12 "(c) Carrying out disciplinary actions appropriate to findings made by a panel or an
13 administrative law judge.

14 "(d) Suspending, revoking, or otherwise limiting certificates after the conclusion of
15 disciplinary actions.

16 "(e) Reviewing the quality of medical practice carried out by physician and surgeon
17 certificate holders under the jurisdiction of the board.

18 "..."

19 7. Code section 2227, subdivision (a), provides as follows:

20 "(a) A licensee whose matter has been heard by an administrative law judge of the Medical
21 Quality Hearing Panel as designated in Section 11371 of the Government Code, or whose default
22 has been entered, and who is found guilty, or who has entered into a stipulation for disciplinary
23 action with the board, may, in accordance with the provisions of this chapter:

24 "(1) Have his or her license revoked upon order of the board.

25 "(2) Have his or her right to practice suspended for a period not to exceed one year upon
26 order of the board.

27 "(3) Be placed on probation and be required to pay the costs of probation monitoring upon
28 order of the board.

1 “(4) Be publicly reprimanded by the board. The public reprimand may include a
2 requirement that the licensee complete relevant educational courses approved by the board.

3 “(5) Have any other action taken in relation to discipline as part of an order of probation, as
4 the board or an administrative law judge may deem proper.

5 “(b) Any matter heard pursuant to subdivision (a), except for warning letters, medical
6 review or advisory conferences, professional competency examinations, continuing education
7 activities, and cost reimbursement associated therewith that are agreed to with the board and
8 successfully completed by the licensee, or other matters made confidential or privileged by
9 existing law, is deemed public, and shall be made available to the public by the board pursuant to
10 Section 803.1.”

11 8. Section 2234 of the Code, states:

12 "The board shall take action against any licensee who is charged with unprofessional
13 conduct. In addition to other provisions of this article, unprofessional conduct includes, but is not
14 limited to, the following:

15 "(a) Violating or attempting to violate, directly or indirectly, assisting in or abetting the
16 violation of, or conspiring to violate any provision of this chapter.

17 "(b) Gross negligence.

18 "(c) Repeated negligent acts. To be repeated, there must be two or more negligent acts or
19 omissions. An initial negligent act or omission followed by a separate and distinct departure from
20 the applicable standard of care shall constitute repeated negligent acts.

21 "(1) An initial negligent diagnosis followed by an act or omission medically appropriate
22 for that negligent diagnosis of the patient shall constitute a single negligent act.

23 "(2) When the standard of care requires a change in the diagnosis, act, or omission that
24 constitutes the negligent act described in paragraph (1), including, but not limited to, a
25 reevaluation of the diagnosis or a change in treatment, and the licensee's conduct departs from the
26 applicable standard of care, each departure constitutes a separate and distinct breach of the
27 standard of care.

28 "(d) Incompetence.

1 "(e) The commission of any act involving dishonesty or corruption which is substantially
2 related to the qualifications, functions, or duties of a physician and surgeon.

3 "(f) Any action or conduct which would have warranted the denial of a certificate.

4 "(g) The practice of medicine from this state into another state or country without meeting
5 the legal requirements of that state or country for the practice of medicine. Section 2314 shall not
6 apply to this subdivision. This subdivision shall become operative upon the implementation of the
7 proposed registration program described in Section 2052.5.

8 "(h) The repeated failure by a certificate holder, in the absence of good cause, to attend and
9 participate in an interview by the board. This subdivision shall only apply to a certificate holder
10 who is the subject of an investigation by the board."

11 9. Section 820 of the Code states:

12 "Whenever it appears that any person holding a license, certificate or permit under this
13 division or under any initiative act referred to in this division may be unable to practice his or her
14 profession safely because the licentiate's ability to practice is impaired due to mental illness, or
15 physical illness affecting competency, the licensing agency may order the licentiate to be
16 examined by one or more physicians and surgeons or psychologists designated by the agency.
17 The report of the examiners shall be made available to the licentiate and may be received as direct
18 evidence in proceedings conducted pursuant to Section 822."

19 10. Section 822 of the Code states:

20 "If a licensing agency determines that its licentiate's ability to practice his or her profession
21 safely is impaired because the licentiate is mentally ill, or physically ill affecting competency, the
22 licensing agency may take action by any one of the following methods:

23 "(a) Revoking the licentiate's certificate or license.

24 "(b) Suspending the licentiate's right to practice.

25 "(c) Placing the licentiate on probation.

26 "(d) Taking such other action in relation to the licentiate as the licensing agency in its
27 discretion deems proper.

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1 "The licensing agency shall not reinstate a revoked or suspended certificate or license until
2 it has received competent evidence of the absence or control of the condition which caused its
3 action and until it is satisfied that with due regard for the public health and safety the person's
4 right to practice his or her profession may be safely reinstated."

5 **CAUSE FOR DISCIPLINE**

6 **(Physical and Mental Deterioration)**

7 11. Respondent Alex Abbassi, M.D. is subject to disciplinary action under section 822 in
8 that Respondent is suffering from physical and mental deterioration due to advanced age. The
9 circumstances are as follows:

10 12. On or about May 11, 2015, a report was received following a voluntary mental
11 examination of Respondent. That report indicates that Respondent is suffering from a decline in
12 his cognitive abilities. Because of the decline in his cognitive abilities Respondent's license is
13 subject to revocation pursuant to Code section 822.

14 **PRAYER**

15 WHEREFORE, Complainant requests that a hearing be held on the matters herein alleged,
16 and that following the hearing, the Medical Board of California issue a decision:


- 17 1. Revoking or suspending Physician's and Surgeon's Certificate Number C37895,
18 issued to Alex Abbassi, M.D.;
- 19 2. Revoking, suspending or denying approval of Alex Abbassi, M.D.'s authority to
20 supervise physician assistants, pursuant to section 3527 of the Code;
- 21 3. Ordering Alex Abbassi, M.D., if placed on probation, to pay the Board the costs of
22 probation monitoring; and

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4. Taking such other and further action as deemed necessary and proper.
