
DECISION

17 Respondent.
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19 **PARTIES**

20 1. Kimberly Kirchmeyer (Complainant) is the Executive Director of the Medical Board
21 of California (Board). She brought this action solely in her official capacity and is represented in
22 this matter by Xavier Becerra, Attorney General of the State of California, by Ryan J. Yates,
23 Deputy Attorney General.

24 2. Respondent Michael Perry Bass, M.D. (Respondent) is represented in this matter by
25 attorney Robert W. Hodges, from the Law Offices of McNamara, Ney, Beatty, Slattery, Borges &
26 Ambacher, LLP; located at 3480 Buskirk Ave., #250, Pleasant Hill, CA, 94523.

27 3. On or about July 28, 1970, the Board issued Physician's and Surgeon's Certificate
28 No. C 32503 to Michael Perry Bass, M.D. (Respondent). The Physician's and Surgeon's

1 Certificate was in full force and effect at all times relevant to the charges brought in Accusation
2 No. 800-2017-032805 and will expire on September 30, 2019, unless renewed.

3 IT IS HEREBY STIPULATED AND AGREED by and between the parties to the above-
4 entitled proceedings that the following matters are true:

5 **JURISDICTION**

6 4. On or about June 7, 2019, Accusation No. 800-2017-032805 has not yet been filed
7 before the Board, but will be filed concurrently with this document. Respondent elected to
8 surrender his Physician's and Surgeon's Certificate No. C 32503. A copy of Accusation No. 800-
9 2017-032805 is attached as Exhibit 1 and incorporated by reference as if fully set forth herein.

10 **ADVISEMENT AND WAIVERS**

11 5. Respondent has carefully read, and understands the charges and allegations in
12 Accusation No. 800-2017-032805. Respondent also has carefully read, and fully understands the
13 effects of this Stipulated Surrender of License and Disciplinary Order.

14 6. Respondent is fully aware of his legal rights in this matter, including the right to a
15 hearing on the charges and allegations in Accusation No. 800-2017-032805; the right to confront
16 and cross-examine the witnesses against him; the right to present evidence and to testify on his
17 own behalf; the right to the issuance of subpoenas to compel the attendance of witnesses and the
18 production of documents; the right to reconsideration and court review of an adverse decision;
19 and all other rights accorded him pursuant to the California Administrative Procedure Act, the
20 California Code of Civil Procedure, and all other applicable laws.

21 7. Respondent voluntarily, knowingly, and intelligently waives and gives up each and
22 every right set forth and/or referenced above.

23 **CULPABILITY**

24 8. Respondent understands that the charges and allegations in Accusation No. 800-2017-
25 032805, if proven at hearing, constitute cause for imposing discipline upon his Physician's and
26 Surgeon's Certificate.

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1 9. For the purpose of resolving the Accusation without the expense of uncertainty of
2 further proceedings, Respondent agrees that, at a hearing, Complainant could establish a factual
3 basis for the charges in the Accusation and that those charges constitute cause for discipline.
4 Respondent hereby gives up his right to contest that cause for discipline exists based on those
5 charges.

6 10. Respondent understands that by signing this stipulation he enables the Board to issue
7 an order accepting the surrender of his Physician's and Surgeon's Certificate without further
8 process.

9 **CONTINGENCY**

10 11. Pursuant to Business and Professions Code section 2224, subdivision (b), the
11 Executive Director of the Medical Board of California has been delegated the authority to adopt
12 or reject a stipulation for surrender of a Physician's and Surgeon's Certificate.

13 12. The parties agree that this Stipulated Surrender of License and Disciplinary Order
14 shall be null and void and not binding upon the parties unless approved by the Executive Director
15 on behalf of the Medical Board of California. Respondent fully understands and agrees that in
16 deciding whether or not to approve and adopt this Stipulated Surrender of License and
17 Disciplinary Order, the Executive Director and/or the Medical Board may receive oral and written
18 communications from its staff and/or the Attorney General's Office. Communications pursuant
19 to this paragraph shall not disqualify the Executive Director, the Board, any member thereof,
20 and/or any other person from future participation in this or any other matter affecting or involving
21 respondent. In the event that the Executive Director on behalf of the Medical Board does not, in
22 her discretion, approve and adopt this Stipulated Surrender of License and Disciplinary Order,
23 with the exception of this paragraph, it shall not become effective, shall be of no evidentiary
24 value whatsoever, and shall not be relied upon or introduced in any disciplinary action by either
25 party hereto. Respondent further agrees that should this Stipulated Surrender of License and
26 Disciplinary Order be rejected for any reason by the Executive Director on behalf of the Board,
27 respondent will assert no claim that the Board, or any member thereof, was prejudiced by
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1 its/his/her review, discussion and/or consideration of this Stipulated Surrender of License and
2 Disciplinary Order or of any matter or matters related hereto.

3 13. The Executive Director shall have a reasonable period of time in which to consider
4 and act on this stipulation after receiving it. By signing this stipulation, respondent fully
5 understands and agrees that he may not withdraw his agreement or seek to rescind this stipulation
6 prior to the time the Executive Director considers and acts upon it.

7 **ADDITIONAL PROVISIONS**

8 14. This Stipulated Surrender of License and Disciplinary Order is intended by the parties
9 herein to be an integrated writing representing the complete, final and exclusive embodiment of
10 the agreement of the parties in the above-entitled matter.

11 15. The parties understand and agree that copies of this Stipulated Surrender of License
12 and Disciplinary Order, including copies of the signatures of the parties, may be used in lieu of
13 original documents and signatures and, further, that such copies and signatures shall have the
14 same force and effect as the originals.

15 16. In consideration of the foregoing admissions and stipulations, the parties agree that
16 the Executive Director of the Medical Board may, without further notice to or opportunity to be
17 heard by Respondent, issue and enter the following Order on behalf of the Board:

18 **ORDER**

19 IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that Physician's and Surgeon's Certificate No. C 32503, issued
20 to Respondent Michael Perry Bass, M.D., is surrendered and accepted by the Medical Board of
21 California.

22 1. The surrender of Respondent's Physician's and Surgeon's Certificate No. C 32503
23 and the acceptance of the surrendered license by the Board shall constitute the imposition of
24 discipline against Respondent. This stipulation constitutes a record of the discipline and shall
25 become a part of Respondent's license history with the Medical Board of California.

26 2. Respondent shall lose all rights and privileges as a Physician and Surgeon in
27 California as of the effective date of the Board's Decision and Order.
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1 3. Respondent shall cause to be delivered to the Board his pocket license and, if one was
2 issued, his wall certificate on or before the effective date of the Decision and Order.

3 4. If Respondent ever files an application for licensure or a petition for reinstatement in
4 the State of California, the Board shall treat it as a petition for reinstatement. Respondent must
5 comply with all the laws, regulations and procedures for reinstatement of a revoked license in
6 effect at the time the petition is filed, and all of the charges and allegations contained in
7 Accusation No. 800-2017-032805 shall be deemed to be true, correct and admitted by Respondent
8 when the Board determines whether to grant or deny the petition.

9 5. Respondent may not petition for reinstatement of a revoked or surrendered license for
10 three (3) years from the effective date of this Decision.

11 6. If Respondent should ever apply or reapply for a new license or certification, or
12 petition for reinstatement of a license, by any other health care licensing agency in the State of
13 California, all of the charges and allegations contained in Accusation No. 800-2017-032805 shall
14 be deemed to be true, correct, and admitted by respondent for the purpose of any Statement of
15 Issues or any other proceeding seeking to deny or restrict licensure.


16 **ACCEPTANCE**

17 I have carefully read the above Stipulated Surrender of License and Disciplinary Order and
18 have fully discussed it with my attorney, Robert W. Hodges, Esq. I understand the stipulation
19 and the effect it will have on my Physician's and Surgeon's Certificate No. C 32503. I enter into
20 this Stipulated Surrender of License and Disciplinary Order voluntarily, knowingly, and
21 intelligently, and agree to be bound by the Decision and Order of the Medical Board of
22 California.



ACCUSATION

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PARTIES

1. Kimberly Kirchmeyer (Complainant) brings this Accusation solely in her official capacity as the Executive Director of the Medical Board of California, Department of Consumer Affairs (Board).
2. On or about July 28, 1970, the Medical Board issued Physician's and Surgeon's Certificate Number C 32503 to Michael Perry Bass, M.D. (Respondent). The Physician's and Surgeon's Certificate was in full force and effect at all times relevant to the charges brought herein and expired on September 30, 2019.

1 PRIOR DISCIPLINARY ACTION

2 3. On October 24, 1992, a Board Decision became effective, which revoked
3 Respondent's medical license for self-prescribing and fraudulent prescribing practices.

4 On November 5, 1999, a Decision became effective which reinstated Respondent's
5 license and placed him on probation with terms and conditions. On May 6, 2005, Respondent
6 completed probation.

7 JURISDICTION

8 4. This Accusation is brought before the Board, under the authority of the following
9 laws. All section references are to the Business and Professions Code (Code) unless
10 otherwise indicated.

11 5. Section 2227 of the Code states:

12 (a) A licensee whose matter has been heard by an administrative law judge
13 of the Medical Quality Hearing Panel as designated in Section 11371 of the
14 Government Code, or whose default has been entered, and who is found guilty, or
15 who has entered into a stipulation for disciplinary action with the board, may, in
16 accordance with the provisions of this chapter:

17 (1) Have his or her license revoked upon order of the board.

18 (2) Have his or her right to practice suspended for a period not to exceed
19 one year upon order of the board.

20 (3) Be placed on probation and be required to pay the costs of probation
21 monitoring upon order of the board.

22 (4) Be publicly reprimanded by the board. The public reprimand may
23 include a requirement that the licensee complete relevant educational courses
24 approved by the board.

25 (5) Have any other action taken in relation to discipline as part of an order
26 of probation, as the board or an administrative law judge may deem proper.

27 (b) Any matter heard pursuant to subdivision (a), except for warning
28 letters, medical review or advisory conferences, professional competency
examinations, continuing education activities, and cost reimbursement associated
therewith that are agreed to with the board and successfully completed by the
licensee, or other matters made confidential or privileged by existing law, is
deemed public, and shall be made available to the public by the board pursuant to
Section 803.1.

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1 6. Section 2234 of the Code, states:

2 The board shall take action against any licensee who is charged with
3 unprofessional conduct. In addition to other provisions of this article,
4 unprofessional conduct includes, but is not limited to, the following:

5 (a) Violating or attempting to violate, directly or indirectly, assisting in or
6 abetting the violation of, or conspiring to violate any provision of this chapter.

7 (b) Gross negligence.

8 (c) Repeated negligent acts. To be repeated, there must be two or more
9 negligent acts or omissions. An initial negligent act or omission followed by a
10 separate and distinct departure from the applicable standard of care shall
11 constitute repeated negligent acts.

12 (1) An initial negligent diagnosis followed by an act or omission medically
13 appropriate for that negligent diagnosis of the patient shall constitute a single
14 negligent act.

15 (2) When the standard of care requires a change in the diagnosis, act, or
16 omission that constitutes the negligent act described in paragraph (1), including,
17 but not limited to, a reevaluation of the diagnosis or a change in treatment, and
18 the licensee's conduct departs from the applicable standard of care, each
19 departure constitutes a separate and distinct breach of the standard of care.

20 (d) Incompetence.

21 (e) The commission of any act involving dishonesty or corruption which is
22 substantially related to the qualifications, functions, or duties of a physician and
23 surgeon.

24 (f) Any action or conduct which would have warranted the denial of a
25 certificate.

26 (g) The practice of medicine from this state into another state or country
27 without meeting the legal requirements of that state or country for the practice
28 of medicine. Section 2314 shall not apply to this subdivision. This subdivision
29 shall become operative upon the implementation of the proposed registration
30 program described in Section 2052.5.

31 (h) The repeated failure by a certificate holder, in the absence of good
32 cause, to attend and participate in an interview by the board. This subdivision
33 shall only apply to a certificate holder who is the subject of an investigation by
34 the board.

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1 7. Section 822 of the Code states:

2 If a licensing agency determines that its licentiate's ability to practice his
3 or her profession safely is impaired because the licentiate is mentally ill, or
4 physically ill affecting competency, the licensing agency may take action by any
one of the following methods:

5 (a) Revoking the licentiate's certificate or license.

6 (b) Suspending the licentiate's right to practice.

7 (c) Placing the licentiate on probation.

8 (d) Taking such other action in relation to the licentiate as the licensing
9 agency in its discretion deems proper.

10 The licensing section shall not reinstate a revoked or suspended certificate
11 or license until it has received competent evidence of the absence or control of
12 the condition which caused its action and until it is satisfied that with due
13 regard for the public health and safety the person's right to practice his or her
profession may be safely reinstated.

14 **CAUSE FOR RESTRICTION AND/OR REVOCATION**
15 **(Mental or Physical Illness Affecting Competency to Practice Medicine)**

16 8. Respondent's Physician's and Surgeon's Certificate No. C 32503 is subject to
17 disciplinary action under section 822 of the Code in that his ability to practice medicine
18 safely is impaired because he is mentally or physically ill affecting competency, as more
19 particularly alleged hereinafter.

20 9. On or about April 28, 2017, Respondent maintained a part-time practice in
21 California, where he worked as the medical director at the Live Well Medical Center, in
22 Rancho Cordova, several times monthly. At or about this time, Respondent was working
23 with the Partnership HealthPlan of California, a non-profit health care organization that
24 contracts with the State of California to administer Medi-Cal benefits through local care
25 providers, such as Respondent's clinic.

26 10. On or about April 28, 2017, Respondent attended the PACE program, where his
27 competency to practice medicine was evaluated by several medical practitioners.

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1 11. On May 8, 2017, PACE submitted an assessment report to the Partnership
2 HealthPlan of California Re-credentialing Committee, which found that Respondent did not
3 demonstrate sufficient knowledge as a neurologist, nor as a general practitioner. PACE
4 recommended that Respondent be removed from clinical practice immediately, and that
5 Respondent undergo a comprehensive psychiatric fitness for duty evaluation.

6 12. On or about February 1, 2019, Respondent participated in a psychiatric
7 examination, conducted by Dr. G. Dr. G. found that Respondent had significant trouble
8 relaying his personal history, including the chronology of his previous problems with the
9 Medical Board and also seemed not to understand the patient safety concerns that his
10 performance on the PACE evaluation suggests. His presentation was suggestive of some
11 underlying processing or memory issues that would have an impact on his ability to practice
12 medicine competently and safely. It is Dr. G's opinion that Respondent is not currently able
13 to practice medicine safely, and therefore would represent a danger to the general public if he
14 was still practicing.

15 13. On or about May 3, 2019, this matter was referred to Dr. W., a Clinical
16 Neuropsychologist. On or about June 20, 2019, Dr. W. met with Respondent for a
17 neuropsychological evaluation. Dr. W. found that Respondent was suffering from a
18 neurocognitive disorder—age related dementia—and concluded that permitting Respondent
19 to continue to engage in the practice of medicine will endanger the public health, safety, and
20 welfare. In forming his opinion, Dr. W. administered numerous tests. He also took
21 Respondent's relevant history, including but not limited to psychological, social,
22 employment, and family history.

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PRAYER

WHEREFORE, Complainant requests that a hearing be held on the matters herein alleged, and that following the hearing, the Medical Board of California issue a decision:

1. Revoking or suspending Physician's and Surgeon's Certificate No. C 32503, issued to Michael Perry Bass, M.D.;
2. Revoking, suspending or denying approval of Michael Perry Bass, M.D.'s authority to supervise physician assistants and advanced practice nurses;
3. Ordering Michael Perry Bass, M.D., if placed on probation, to pay the Board the costs of probation monitoring; and
4. Taking such other and further action as deemed necessary and proper.
