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on July 9, 2020, pursuant to Section 2310(a) of the Business and Professions Code. (Exhibit Package, Exhibit 1¹, license certification.)

- 3. On September 21, 2020, Respondent was duly served with an Accusation, alleging causes for discipline against Respondent. (Exhibit Package, Exhibit 2, Accusation.)
- 4. The allegations of the Accusation are true as follows based on certified records which are attached as Exhibit A to the Accusation (Exhibit Package, Exhibit 2).
 - On August 8, 2019, the Arkansas State Medical Board (Arkansas Board) filed an
 "Order and Notice of Hearing" against Naga Lakshmi Battala, M.D. listing
 violations of the Arkansas Medical Practices Act, specifically, A.C.A. section 17 95-409(a)(2)(g). This charged that Respondent exhibited "gross negligence and
 ignorant malpractice" in the manner in which she treated one patient.
 - The Arkansas matter alleged that Respondent assessed her pregnant patient to be "at risk" and admitted said patient to the hospital for a Cesarean section. Shortly after determining the risk and admitting the patient, Respondent left the hospital.
 - The patient's condition deteriorated quickly and the patient needed emergency surgery. Despite multiple attempts, Respondent could not be reached by phone.
 The patient was taken to the operating room where another surgeon had to perform surgery.
 - On March 17, 2020, the Arkansas State Medical Board entered a Consent Order (Consent Order) with the Respondent.
 - The Consent Order included an agreement that Respondent not practice in the state of Arkansas or utilize her Arkansas medical license until she returns to the Arkansas State Medical Board after having attended the Physician Assessment and Clinical Education (P.A.C.E.) program in San Diego.
 - The Consent Order further requires that Respondent complete the P.A.C.E. course within six months of February 6, 2020, and appear before the Arkansas State

Medical Board with the results of the P.A.C.E. program before the suspension of the license is lifted.

- 5. On September 21, 2020, an employee of the Medical Board of California sent by certified mail a copy of Accusation No. 800-2020-065974, Statement to Respondent, Notice of Defense in blank, and Request for Discovery to Respondent's address of record with the Board, which was and is 808 W. 58th St., Los Angeles, CA 90037-3632. The United States Post Office tracking system noted the package was delivered on September 24, 2020. (Exhibit Package, Exhibit 2, Accusation, proof of service; Exhibit 3, USPS tracking printout.)
- 6. There was no response to the Accusation. On October 6, 2020, an employee of the Attorney General's Office sent a Courtesy Notice of Default, by certified mail, addressed to Respondent at the address of record above, as well as to an Arkansas address associated with Respondent: 808 Hwy 278 W Apt. A5, Monticello, AR 71655. The Courtesy Notice of Default advised Respondent of the service Accusation, and provided her with an opportunity to file a Notice of Defense and request relief from default. The United States Post Office tracking system noted the package was delivered to Respondent's California address of record on October 9, 2020. There is no service to the second address, in Arkansas, associated with Respondent. (Exhibit Package, Exhibit 4, Courtesy Notice of Default, proof of service, USPS tracking printouts.)
- 7. Respondent has not responded to service of the Accusation or the Notice of Default. She has not filed a Notice of Defense. As a result, Respondent has waived her right to a hearing on the merits to contest the allegations contained in the Accusation.
- 8. Service of the Accusation was effective as a matter of law under the provisions of Government Code section 11505, subdivision (c).

STATUTORY AUTHORITY

- 9. Government Code section 11506 states, in pertinent part:
- "(c) The respondent shall be entitled to a hearing on the merits if the respondent files a notice of defense, and the notice shall be deemed a specific denial of all parts of the accusation

not expressly admitted. Failure to file a notice of defense shall constitute a waiver of respondent's right to a hearing, but the agency in its discretion may nevertheless grant a hearing."

- Respondent failed to file a Notice of Defense within 15 days after service upon her of the Accusation, and therefore waived her right to a hearing on the merits of Accusation No. 800-2020-065974.
 - California Government Code section 11520 states, in pertinent part:
- "(a) If the respondent either fails to file a notice of defense or to appear at the hearing, the agency may take action based upon the respondent's express admissions or upon other evidence and affidavits may be used as evidence without any notice to respondent."

DETERMINATION OF ISSUES

- The Board has jurisdiction to adjudicate this case by default, and pursuant to 1. Government Code section 11520, finds that Respondent is in default. The Board will take action without further proceedings or hearing and, based on Respondent's admissions by way of default and the evidence before the Board, contained in the Exhibit Package, finds that the allegations in Accusation No. 800-2020-065974, are true and correct.
- Respondent's conduct and the action of the Arkansas State Medical Board constitute 2. cause for discipline within the meaning of Business and Professions Code sections 2305 and 141(a).

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DISCIPLINARY ORDER

Physician's and Surgeon's Certificate No. A 104785, issued to NAGA LAKSHMI BATTALA, M.D., is hereby **REVOKED**.

Respondent shall not be deprived of making a request for relief from default as set forth in Government Code section 11520(c) for good cause shown. However, such showing must be made in writing by way of a motion to vacate the default decision and directed to the Medical Board of California at 2005 Evergreen Street, Suite 1200, Sacramento, CA 95815 within seven (7) days of the service of this Decision. The agency in its discretion may vacate the Decision and grant a hearing on a showing of good cause, as defined in the statute.

JURISDICTION

This Accusation is brought before the Board, under the authority of the following laws. All section references are to the Business and Professions Code (Code) unless otherwise indicated.

- 3. Section 2227 of the Code provides that a licensee who is found guilty under the Medical Practice Act may have his or her license revoked, suspended for a period not to exceed one year, placed on probation and required to pay the costs of probation monitoring, or such other action taken in relation to discipline as the Board deems proper.
- 4. Section 2305 of the Code provides, in part, that the revocation, suspension, or other discipline, restriction or limitation imposed by another state upon a license to practice medicine issued by that state, or the revocation, suspension, or restriction of the authority to practice medicine by any agency of the federal government, that would have been grounds for discipline in California under the Medical Practice Act, constitutes grounds for discipline for unprofessional conduct.
 - 5. Section 141 of the Code states:
 - (a) For any licensee holding a license issued by a board under the jurisdiction of the department, a disciplinary action taken by another state, by any agency of the federal government, or by another country for any act substantially related to the practice regulated by the California license, may be a ground for disciplinary action by the respective state licensing board. A certified copy of the record of the disciplinary action taken against the licensee by another state, an agency of the federal government, or another country shall be conclusive evidence of the events related therein.
 - (b) Nothing in this section shall preclude a board from applying a specific statutory provision in the licensing act administered by that board that provides for discipline based upon a disciplinary action taken against the licensee by another state, an agency of the federal government, or another country.

CAUSE FOR DISCIPLINE

(Discipline, Restriction, or Limitation Imposed by Another State)

6. On March 17, 2020, the Arkansas State Medical Board entered a Consent Order with Respondent that included an agreement that she not practice in the state of Arkansas or utilize her Arkansas medical license until she returns to the Arkansas State Medical Board after having attended the Physician Assessment and Clinical Education (P.A.C.E.) program in San Diego. The Consent Order further states that Respondent must complete the P.A.C.E. course within six

On this 6th day of February, 2020, comes on for hearing the matter of Naga Lakshmi Battala, M.D. The Arkansas State Medical Board appeared together by a quorum of its membership together with its attorney, Kevin M. O'Dwyer; Naga Lakshmi Battala, M.D., appeared with her attorney, Chris Burks. From the pleadings, evidence introduced, and agreement of the parties, the Board finds that:

I,

Naga Lakshmi Battala, M.D., is licensed to practice medicine in the State of Arkansas and under the provisions of the Medical Practices Act.

II.

Naga Lakshmi Battala, M.D. makes the following offer to the Arkansas State Medical Board, pursuant to A.C.A. §25-15-208(b) of the Administrative Procedure Act as follows:

- A. Naga Lakshmi Battala, M.D. agrees to not practice in the state of Arkansas or utilize her Arkansas medical license and that her license will be suspended until such time that she returns to the Arkansas State Medical Board after having attended the P.A.C.E. in San Diego, California;
- B. Naga Lakshmi Battala, M.D. must provide proof to the Arkansas State Medial Board within sixty (60) days of February 6, 2020 that she is registered for a full evaluation to determine her clinical competency as well as an evaluation on any other factors that may affect her ability to safely practice medicine;
- C. Naga Lakshmi Battala, M.D. must complete the P.A.C.E. course within six (6) months of February 6, 2020; and

Naga Lakshmi Battala, M.D. must appear before the Arkansas State Medical Board D. with the results of the P.A.C.E. program prior to the suspension of her license being lifted.

WHEREFORE, IT IS CONSIDERED, ORDERED AND ADJUDGED that the agreement of the parties stated in paragraph II above is a fair and equitable agreement and the Board adopts the same as the Board's own Order.

ORDER AND NOTICE OF HEARING

Pursuant to Ark. Code Ann. § 25-15-201 of the Administrative Procedures Act, and Ark. Code Ann. §17-95-410 of the Medical Practices Act, the Arkansas State Medical Board issues the following Order and Notice of Hearing charging Naga Lakshmi Battala, M.D., with alleged violations of the Medical Practices Act, more specifically, A.C.A. §17-95-409(a)(2)(g) that is, she exhibited gross negligence and ignorant malpractice in the manner in which she treated one patient. The allegations upon which the above charges are based are as follows:

T.

Naga Lakshmi Battala, M.D. is a licensed physician in the State of Arkansas under the provisions of the Medical Practices Act.

11.

Naga Lakshmi Battala, M.D., exhibited gross negligence and ignorant malpractice in the manner in which she treated her pregnant patient, B.P. Specifically, Naga Lakshmi Battala had assessed the patient to be at risk and admitted her to Drew Memorial Hospital for a Cesarean section. Shortly after determining the risk and admitting the patient, Naga Lakshmi Battala, M.D. left the hospital and went home. The patient's condition deteriorated quickly and needed emergency surgery. Despite multiple attempts, Dr. Battala could not be reached by phone. The patient was taken to the operating room where another surgeon had to perform surgery. The actions of Naga Lakshmi Battala, M.D. constitute patient abandonment and constitute gross negligence and ignorant malpractice.

III.

WHEREFORE, IT IS CONSIDERED, ORDERED AND ADJUDGED by the Arkansas State Medical Board that a hearing should be conducted to determine whether Naga

Lakshmi Battala, M.D., has violated the Medical Practices Act as alleged hereinabove. If it is found that she has, in fact, violated the Medical Practices Act, then the Board should determine whether the license of Naga Lakshmi Battala, M.D., to practice medicine in the State of Arkansas, should be revoked or suspended, or whether other sanctions should be given as punishment pursuant to the authority granted the Board in A.C.A. §17-95-410.

Said hearing will be conducted at 3:30 o'clock 1 .m. on the 3 day of October , 2019, at the offices of the Arkansas State Medical Board at 1401 W. Capitol Ave., Suite 340, Little Rock, Arkansas.

Naga Lakshmi Battala, M.D. is hereby advised that she may be represented by counsel at the hearing and that she will be given the opportunity to examine all of the evidence offered to the Board, cross-examine witnesses, and offer evidence and witnesses in her own behalf.
