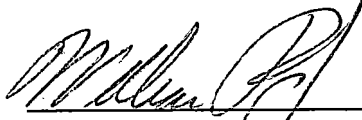
DECISION

**STIPULATED SURRENDER OF
LICENSE AND ORDER**

14 **Physician's and Surgeon's Certificate**
15 **No. C 36244,**

Respondent.

17 IT IS HEREBY STIPULATED AND AGREED by and between the parties to the above-
18 entitled proceedings that the following matters are true:

19 **PARTIES**

20 1. William Prasifka (Complainant) is the Executive Director of the Medical Board of
21 California (Board). He brought this action solely in his official capacity and is represented in this
22 matter by Rob Bonta, Attorney General of the State of California, by Judith T. Alvarado,
23 Supervising Deputy Attorney General.

24 2. Robert Franklin Fischer, M.D. (Respondent) is represented in this proceeding by
25 Mark B. Connely, Esq., whose address is Hall Hieatt & Connely, LLP, 1319 Marsh Street,
26 Second Floor, San Luis Obispo, CA 93401.

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3. On or about December 6, 1974, the Board issued Physician's and Surgeon's Certificate No. C 36244 to Respondent. That Physician's and Surgeon's Certificate expired on December 31, 2021, and has not been renewed.

JURISDICTION

4. Accusation No. 800-2021-081072 was filed before the Board, and is currently pending against Respondent. The Accusation and all other statutorily required documents were properly served on Respondent. Respondent timely filed his Notice of Defense contesting the Accusation. A copy of Accusation No. 800-2021-081072 is attached as Exhibit A and incorporated by reference.

ADVISEMENT AND WAIVERS

5. Respondent has carefully read, fully discussed with counsel, and understands the charges and allegations in Accusation No. 800-2021-081072. Respondent also has carefully read, fully discussed with counsel, and understands the effects of this Stipulated Surrender of License and Order.

6. Respondent is fully aware of his legal rights in this matter, including the right to a hearing on the charges and allegations in the Accusation; the right to confront and cross-examine the witnesses against him; the right to present evidence and to testify on his own behalf; the right to the issuance of subpoenas to compel the attendance of witnesses and the production of documents; the right to reconsideration and court review of an adverse decision; and all other rights accorded by the California Administrative Procedure Act and other applicable laws.

7. Respondent voluntarily, knowingly, and intelligently waives and gives up each and every right set forth above.

CULPABILITY

8. Respondent admits the truth of each and every charge and allegation in Accusation No. 800-2021-081072, agrees that cause exists for discipline and hereby surrenders his Physician's and Surgeon's Certificate No. C 36244 for the Board's formal acceptance.

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1 9. Respondent understands that by signing this stipulation he enables the Board to issue
2 an order accepting the surrender of his Physician's and Surgeon's Certificate without further
3 process.

4 **RESERVATION**

5 10. The admissions made by Respondent herein are only for the purposes of this
6 proceeding, or any other proceedings in which the Medical Board of California or other
7 professional licensing agency is involved, and shall not be admissible in any other criminal or
8 civil proceeding.

9 **CONTINGENCY**

10 11. This stipulation shall be subject to approval by the Board. Respondent understands
11 and agrees that counsel for Complainant and the staff of the Board may communicate directly
12 with the Board regarding this stipulation and surrender, without notice to or participation by
13 Respondent or his counsel. By signing the stipulation, Respondent understands and agrees that he
14 may not withdraw his agreement or seek to rescind the stipulation prior to the time the Board
15 considers and acts upon it. If the Board fails to adopt this stipulation as its Decision and Order,
16 the Stipulated Surrender and Disciplinary Order shall be of no force or effect, except for this
17 paragraph, it shall be inadmissible in any legal action between the parties, and the Board shall not
18 be disqualified from further action by having considered this matter.

19 12. The parties understand and agree that Portable Document Format (PDF) and facsimile
20 copies of this Stipulated Surrender of License and Order, including PDF and facsimile signatures
21 thereto, shall have the same force and effect as the originals.

22 13. In consideration of the foregoing admissions and stipulations, the parties agree that
23 the Board may, without further notice or formal proceeding, issue and enter the following Order:

24 **ORDER**

25 IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that Physician's and Surgeon's Certificate No. C 36244, issued
26 to Respondent ROBERT FRANKLIN FISCHER, M.D., is surrendered and accepted by the
27 Board.

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1 Respondent shall lose all rights and privileges as a physician and surgeon in
2 California as of the effective date of the Board's Decision and Order.

3 2. Respondent shall cause to be delivered to the Board his pocket license and, if one was
4 issued, his wall certificate on or before the effective date of the Decision and Order.

5 3. If Respondent ever files an application for licensure or a petition for reinstatement in
6 the State of California, the Board shall treat it as a petition for reinstatement. Respondent must
7 comply with all the laws, regulations and procedures for reinstatement of a revoked or
8 surrendered license in effect at the time the petition is filed, and all of the charges and allegations
9 contained in Accusation No. 800-2021-081072 shall be deemed to be true, correct and admitted
10 by Respondent when the Board determines whether to grant or deny the petition.

11 4. Respondent shall pay the agency its costs of investigation and enforcement in the
12 amount of \$1,118.75 (One Thousand One Hundred Eleven Dollars and Seventy-Five Cents) prior
13 to issuance of a new or reinstated license.

14 5. If Respondent should ever apply or reapply for a new license or certification, or
15 petition for reinstatement of a license, by any other health care licensing agency in the State of
16 California, all of the charges and allegations contained in Accusation, No. 800-2021-081072 shall
17 be deemed to be true, correct, and admitted by Respondent for the purpose of any Statement of
18 Issues or any other proceeding seeking to deny or restrict licensure.

19 ACCEPTANCE

20 I have carefully read the above Stipulated Surrender of License and Order and have fully
21 discussed it with my attorney. I understand the stipulation and the effect it will have on my
22 Physician's and Surgeon's Certificate. I enter into this Stipulated Surrender of License and Order
23 voluntarily, knowingly, and intelligently, and agree to be bound by the Decision and Order of the
24 Medical Board of California.

18 **PARTIES**

19 1. William Prasifka (Complainant) brings this Accusation solely in his official capacity
20 as the Executive Director of the Medical Board of California, Department of Consumer Affairs
21 (Board).

22 2. On or about December 6, 1974, the Medical Board issued Physician's and Surgeon's
23 Certificate Number C 36244 to Robert Franklin Fischer, M.D. (Respondent). The Physician's and
24 Surgeon's Certificate expired on December 31, 2021, and has not been renewed.

25 **JURISDICTION**

26 3. This Accusation is brought before the Board, under the authority of the following
27 laws. All section references are to the Business and Professions Code (Code) unless otherwise
28 indicated.

1 4. Section 118, subdivision (b) of the Code provides:

2 The suspension, expiration, or forfeiture by operation of law of a license issued
3 by a board in the department, or its suspension, forfeiture, or cancellation by order of
4 the board or by order of a court of law, or its surrender without the written consent of
5 the board, shall not, during any period in which it may be renewed, restore, reissued,
6 or reinstate, deprive the board of its authority to institute or continue a disciplinary
7 proceeding against the licensee upon any ground provided by law or to enter an order
8 suspending or revoking the license or otherwise taking disciplinary action against the
9 license on any such ground.

10 5. Section 2004 of the Code states:

11 The board shall have the responsibility for the following:

12 (a) The enforcement of the disciplinary and criminal provisions of the Medical
13 Practice Act.

14 (b) The administration and hearing of disciplinary actions.

15 (c) Carrying out disciplinary actions appropriate to findings made by a panel or
16 an administrative law judge.

17 (d) Suspending, revoking, or otherwise limiting certificates after the conclusion
18 of disciplinary actions.

19 (e) Reviewing the quality of medical practice carried out by physician and
20 surgeon certificate holders under the jurisdiction of the board.

21 (f) Approving undergraduate and graduate medical education programs.

22 (g) Approving clinical clerkship and special programs and hospitals for the
23 programs in subdivision (f).

24 (h) Issuing licenses and certificates under the board's jurisdiction.

25 (i) Administering the board's continuing medical education program.

26 6. Section 2227 of the Code provides that a licensee who is found guilty under the
27 Medical Practice Act may have his or her license revoked, suspended for a period not to exceed
28 one year, placed on probation and required to pay the costs of probation monitoring, or such other
29 action taken in relation to discipline as the Board deems proper.

30 **COST RECOVERY**

31 7. Section 125.3 of the Code provides, in pertinent part, that the Board may request the
32 administrative law judge to direct a licensee found to have committed a violation or violations of
33 the licensing act to pay a sum not to exceed the reasonable costs of the investigation and

1 enforcement of the case, with failure of the licensee to comply subjecting the license to not being
2 renewed or reinstated. If a case settles, recovery of investigation and enforcement costs may be
3 included in a stipulated settlement.

4 STATUTORY PROVISIONS

5 8. Section 820 of the Code states:

6 Whenever it appears that any person holding a license, certificate or permit
7 under this division or under any initiative act referred to in this division may be
8 unable to practice his or her profession safely because the licentiate's ability to
9 practice is impaired due to mental illness, or physical illness affecting competency,
10 the licensing agency may order the licentiate to be examined by one or more
11 physicians and surgeons or psychologists designated by the agency. The report of the
12 examiners shall be made available to the licentiate and may be received as direct
13 evidence in proceedings conducted pursuant to Section 822.

14 9. Section 822 of the Code states:

15 If a licensing agency determines that its licentiate's ability to practice his or her
16 profession safely is impaired because the licentiate is mentally ill, or physically ill
17 affecting competency, the licensing agency may take action by any one of the
18 following methods:

- 19 (a) Revoking the licentiate's certificate or license.
- 20 (b) Suspending the licentiate's right to practice.
- 21 (c) Placing the licentiate on probation.
- 22 (d) Taking such other action in relation to the licentiate as the licensing agency
23 in its discretion deems proper.

24 The licensing section shall not reinstate a revoked or suspended certificate or
25 license until it has received competent evidence of the absence or control of the
26 condition which caused its action and until it is satisfied that with due regard for the
27 public health and safety the person's right to practice his or her profession may be
28 safely reinstated.

29 CAUSE FOR DISCIPLINE

30 (Inability to Safely Practice Medicine due to Mental/Physical Condition)

31 10. Respondent Robert Franklin Fischer, M.D. is subject to disciplinary action under
32 section 820 of the Code in that he may be unable to safely practice medicine due to a medical
33 condition.

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1 11. On or about August 24, 2021, the Board received a complaint that Respondent may
2 be unable to safely practice medicine due to the fact that he may be suffering from a medical
3 condition.

4 12. On or about January 14, 2022, Respondent submitted a request to surrender his
5 medical license, Physician's and Surgeon's Certificate Number C 36244, to the Board.

6 **PRAYER**

7 WHEREFORE, Complainant requests that a hearing be held on the matters herein alleged,
8 and that following the hearing, the Medical Board of California issue a decision:

9 1. Revoking or suspending Physician's and Surgeon's Certificate Number C 36244,
10 issued to Robert Franklin Fischer, M.D.;

11 2. Revoking, suspending or denying approval of Robert Franklin Fischer, M.D.'s
12 authority to supervise physician assistants and advanced practice nurses;

13 3. Ordering Robert Franklin Fischer, M.D., to pay the Board the costs of the
14 investigation and enforcement of this case, and if placed on probation, the costs of probation
15 monitoring; and,

16 4. Taking such other and further action as deemed necessary and proper.
